# A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Winning! We're all about winning and avoiding losing at all costs. In particular, we will avoid losing or failure with everything we have.

It's natural; we just don't want to suffer embarrassment or defeat. And there's nothing wrong with wanting to win. I'm such a huge fan of sports, and I really get into my teams and live and die with them winning. And I really like it when teams I do not like lose.

That's all for fun. And it's ok to want to be successful at work or school or in sports or hobbies. But when we carry that over to our Faith, it just doesn't work that way.

People will often come up to me and say, "if the Church wants to grow, it needs to change with the times and change its teachings." In this statement is the thought that the Church is "losing" because it may be smaller than it has been in the past. And the way to "win" -- or to grow -- is to change Jesus' Teachings to fit into our times.

First of all, the Church's Teachings -- which come from Jesus and the Apostles -- cannot change. Even if *everyone* left, we are Christians and follow Jesus, and His Teachings cannot be altered in any way.

But even more, the thinking that the Catholic Church needs to change in order to "win" is actually, well, losing right now.

So many people over the last year have asked to enter the Catholic Church. It's more than any time I've ever noticed as a priest. It's awe-some! Don't believe me? It's happening all over the world. In France, 10,000 adults were baptized last Easter, a 45% increase from 2023. And in England, dioceses recorded the highest number of conversions in decades! And in our parish, inquiries for joining the Church come in every week, and our OCIA program is as big as it's been in decades. It is so awesome and exciting. We need a new photo directory because people are either coming back to the Church or they are becoming Catholic!

And why do they want to enter? I ask everyone who wants to join, and the most popular answer is this: "The Catholic Church is the only Church that has been around since the earthly time of Jesus, and it is the only Church which retains His Teachings."

What was once seen as a negative, is now a positive! Why? Because people want to find a place of reliability, stability, and peace amongst a world that is constantly changing, and causing all kinds of volatility. They want the Truth of Jesus!

It does not mean that the Church does not seek to answer the questions of the day. It certainly does! But what it does mean is that Jesus' Teachings are applied to our problems. Sometimes, they are easy to accept. And sometimes they are difficult.

But either way, because we are Christians, we follow HIM, and not our own desires. And the world is suddenly looking at this "stodgy old Church", and it finds peace. Wow!

Something is happening. The world is rediscovering the Church and the Truths of Jesus, and is coming to Him, especially young people. Please be welcoming to those who are new in our Church. They are seeking what we believe!

And, it can be a temptation to feel embarrassed by our Teachings. I know at times I wince at how different they can be to the teachings and dictates of the world.

But people are finding our Savior and His Church here at Seven Sorrows and throughout the world, so let's seek to deepen our understanding of the Truths of Jesus Christ and our desire to live them out, even if they are hard. Through it, Jesus works and brings peace, joy and unity to a broken world. And most of all, SALVATION! May it be through us!
