

A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

I pray you had a great week. I spent the week in Towson, MD, at our annual priest convocation for all of the priests of the Diocese of Harrisburg. We all get together for the week for conferences, social time, dinners, and meetings.

At first glance, it doesn't sound very interesting, and I always miss being at the parish for the week. But being together with our brother priests is such a gift. I don't get to see many of them throughout the year, as we all have our own parishes and our own work. So just being together, whether playing games, cards, eating meals, or making fun of the presenters during the conferences (just joking, maybe!), is a great time.

We have so many awesome priests in our diocese. We are all so different, but then again, so are our parishioners. God truly has given many gifts to many people, including our priests. I feel so blessed to have this vocation and share this life with my brother priests.

Please pray for us; we need your help and prayers, so that we can stay strong in the Faith and help you stay strong as well, so that one day, we may all be together in Heaven with Jesus, our Savior.

Why I Love Being Catholic, Part 50!

I am blown away by the number of our parishioners who have freely shared their Catholic Faith with us. Several more have written, and here are some excerpts from a few parishioners:

"I love that no matter where we go on earth, the Faith is the same. The teachings make sense: faith and reason. The direct line from Jesus down to us in our time." - a long time parishioner

"Growing up, I read the description of the Throne Room in Revelation, that the saints would praise the Lord forever, and secretly thought it sounded kind of boring. The praise services I had attended were fine as far as they went, but I couldn't imagine one of them going on forever and not wanting to leave after only a few hours. While perhaps an understandable thought at a human level, this did, in retrospect, have a significant effect on my life. I was not really looking forward to eternity. I knew I wasn't supposed to feel that way, but I mostly felt that there was stuff I wanted to finish up here first before I gave up and went to heaven. This left me feeling somewhat ambivalent about Christ's return and afraid of my own death. I mostly just allowed myself to not think about it very much.

When I walked into Deacon St. Denis' ordination Mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral, I immediately felt very protestant. The entire structure was so much more ornate, grand, and beautiful than I was used to in a church. It left me feeling out of place, particularly since I had some trouble finding parking and was therefore late enough to be relegated to the standing room only in the very back of the Cathedral. But, standing in the back gave me a clear view of the scene in its entirety: The crucifix high in the center, the tabernacle, the light shining down on it through the dome, the priests gathered around the altar, and the inscriptions "Behold I Am With You All Days" and "I Am The Resurrection And The Life", the many different nationalities clearly represented among the audience. I spent the first portion of the Mass just standing there and taking it all in, getting used to it. It was definitely Catholic, and I appreciated the clear beauty of it, but the dominant feeling was still that this was a very different expression of the faith than what I had grown up accustomed to.

But then there was a particular moment when the soloist hit the high note of a Hallelujah, the entire choir came in, the organist pulled out all the stops, and the whole place *reverberated*. I didn't hear that chord so much as I felt it in my chest. In that moment, I suddenly saw it: the Son of Man high and lifted up, in His Tabernacle, shining in the light of his Father, his elders gathered around him, God among His resurrected people, being praised by every tribe and tongue. I finally *got it*: this is the Throne Room. This Cathedral is our human attempt to build a small scale model in imitation of eternity. And then, with tears streaming down my face, I thought something I've thought only two other times in my life: Yes, I could do this forever."
