

A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last weekend, I spoke at the Masses regarding a potential new project in our parish for a renovated gym and cafeteria – a new social hall for our parish.

As I mentioned, we have a need for a lot of repairs and fixes in the oldest part of our campus: the gym and upper and lower cafeterias. That area of the building was built in 1950, and served as our church and parish hall until 1987. After that, the church was converted into a gym.

Many of the systems in that part of the building are either at the end of their lifespan, or very near the end. The heating and air conditioning systems are nearly done, and the boiler is at the end of its usefulness. The roof needs to be replaced, and the electrical system in the whole area needs to be redone. In addition, the wall facing the church in the lower cafeteria needs to be fixed.

These are issues that – if they came up independently, would not be huge issues. Taken together, we need to address them in total, with a vision towards making this part of our campus functional for the near and distant future.

You will receive a letter and e-mail from us with renderings and information that an architect and builder have helped put together. It is NOT a final plan, and can and may be adjusted. It is, however, a well thought-out plan with the needs of our parish in mind. I included a rendering of the outside of the building to the right. You will see the inside of the project plans in the mailer you will soon receive.

We need your feedback, and whether you support such a plan moving forward. This will be a parish project that will require all of our parish to participate, in one way or another. The anticipated cost of something like this is estimated to be around \$3.7 million dollars. Again, this is not a final plan, but the proposed plan and number will allow us to decide whether we can move forward or not.



Soon, you will receive this information at home. Please fill out the survey from our friends at Kirby-Smith, who are helping us with the feasibility study of our parish. We need your input. Many have already approached me with your opinions, much of which was positive. But we need your opinions. We can't do this without you.

Thank you so much for all that you do for our parish. Together, we will move forward toward Christ as His Body, and we will do so as one parish. Please pray for the continued growth of our parish, and our discernment of this plan. God bless you!

All Saints Day/All Souls Day

Saturday, Nov. 1, is All Saints Day. That day is normally a Holy Day of Obligation, meaning we are to attend Mass. However, because this Feast lands on a Saturday, it is not a day of Obligation, because of some obscure rules. So, we are not obliged to attend Mass, but we'll mark the Feast with Masses on Friday at 6PM and at 9AM on Saturday. Please come and celebrate all of the Saints of the Church that day, and ask for their intercession.

The next day, Sunday, Nov. 2, is All Souls Day, when we pray for all of our deceased family and friends. Because that is a Sunday, all of our Masses that day will remember those who have died. May our prayers at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass assist them in their journey to the Heavenly Kingdom!
