

As we mention in the letter, there is a great need to replace the heating and air conditioning units, the roof, and structural and electrical upgrades.

Please take the time to look the letter over carefully, and also to complete the survey that is included. Both will give us a better understanding of your desires for our parish moving forward.

The necessity for a renovation hit home this week, as our electrical panel in the rectory failed, and needed to be replaced. All of the electrical systems in the gym and cafeteria are older than the one in the rectory, and need attention.

Thank you so much for your careful consideration of the project, and for your feedback. We need it if we are to move forward in any capacity as a parish. May God bless you and thank you for your participation in the life of our parish!

Headline for Christmas sub-story: Too Soon?!



Driving around last weekend, I noticed that many people used the nice weather to put up their Christmas decorations

It was Nov. 9! A month and a half from Christmas!

I'm having a hard time wrapping my mind around the fact that we're even close to Christmas. Of course, about a month ago I snapped this picture at a big box store. I immediately started to freak out, since I thought we were that close! But I realized it wasn't correct. Now, it's almost dead-on. We're getting close.

Are you ready? How much more do you have to do? If Christmas came tomorrow, would you be ready?

Now, I'd like to raise an even more important matter. If we were to meet our judge – Jesus Christ – tomorrow, would we be ready?

Of course we do not know the day nor the hour of that meeting, but we must live in order to be prepared for that unknown moment. Because while the time and date are undecided, the fact that it will happen is not. It WILL happen.

This weekend's readings point to that fact. As we get closer to Advent, all of the readings will focus on the "end times." They are not the "end," though. We will enter eternity at the end of our earthly lives. But we will be judged, and be sent to eternal life or eternal death. Those are the options.

This Advent, I strongly encourage all of our parish to take advantage of the confession times we offer here, whether the regularly scheduled times, or our parish time of confessions in December. Confession is the ONLY way to prepare.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that, once we reach seven years of age, we must confess mortal (serious) sins at least once a year. However, if we have mortal sins on our soul, we should confess them as soon as possible. If we were to die with these sins on our soul, we will be lost to eternal death. It is that serious.

But Jesus is merciful with the remedy. Confession is hard, but it is not impossible. We feel the freedom Jesus' desires for us once we confess whatever sins are bothering and weighing us down.

It's a win-win. Please take advantage of Advent to be ready for Jesus' birth, and also His Second Coming when we all will be judged. God bless you!
