A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

During Christmas, we celebrate so many Feast Days: The Holy Family; Mary, Mother of God; Epiphany; and several Saints Feast Days. Today is another: The Baptism of Our Lord!

Today is actually a day of Ordinary Time, and not the Christmas season, but this Feast Day of Jesus' baptism means we hold off on Ordinary Time for one more day. We have this Feast on the first Sunday of Ordinary Time because this was the event that kicked off Jesus' three years of public ministry.

Jesus was baptized in the Jordan River, at a place that is near Jericho, the ancient city in the Bible that Israel invaded by blowing horns and the city walls came tumbling down.

Jericho is now in the West Bank, which is a Palestinian-controlled territory in Israel. The location of Jesus' baptism is also on the Jordan River, and on the other bank of the river is the country of Jordan.



Here is a picture of the site of Jesus' baptism, on the river. The river is not wide AT ALL. It's not even as wide as the Swatara Creek!

I think I have spoken before that, when I was visiting the awesome site, there were guards on the Jordan side that were holding machine guns.

This is a very tense territory. There are so many competing interests. It seems like this would not be in the spirit of what Jesus' baptism represents, which is Peace and Forgiveness.

But we have to remember that Jesus entered a world that was divided, and even at His baptism, there were people there who did not like John the Baptist (and he called them out!). There was division then, and there is division now.

But that didn't stop Jesus from being present in the messiness, in the division, in the war. Jesus entered right into it. Just like today, He enters with His Divinity, His Holiness, His Mercy, into the disasters of our world today, whether that is in our own lives, our families, our parish, our country or world.

The presence of division and war does not mean He is not here. It just means that we make a mess of what we've been given, no matter the century or day. It does mean that He is always present, and desires for us to recognize His presence in the disasters of our day. Do we run for Him, do we seek Him out, or ignore Him (as the leaders of Jesus' day did)?

Happy Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord, and may it re-ignite our desire to allow Jesus to change us from our unsettledness to His Peace, just as He did on the day of our baptism!

A Steeler blessing?

After the Steelers/Ravens game, in which the Steelers won in a crazy fashion, you may have seen that a priest blessed the field with Holy Water before the game. Here's a photo of him doing it:

The announcer said that the priest blessed just that end zone (where the Steelers eventually won the game). St. Vincent College, where he lives, wrote that Father Max and the other priests there always bless the field before every game, asking God for the safety of the players of both teams.

It just so happens that the Steelers won! Does that mean the blessing worked? Well, for me as a Steeler fan, yes! But God is glorified when we live to our fullest. Our God is with the winners and the losers, as attested by the Ravens kicker, who missed the game-winning field goal. He said after the game that he knows that "God's got his back," no matter what! How true! God bless you!

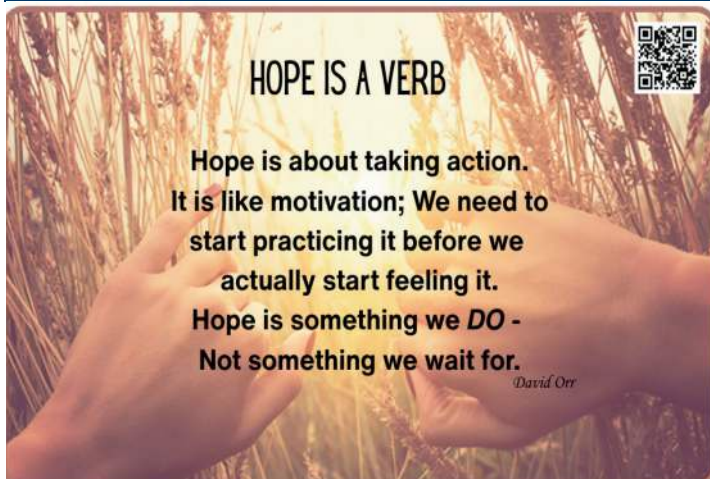
