At APS, we provide counselling services for both adults and children.

Our support covers a wide range of emotional challenges, including anxiety, depression, trauma, loss, and more. We are committed to helping individuals navigate difficult times and improve their emotional wellbeing through compassionate and tailored care.

Our counsellors at APS have experience working with neurodiverse clients and use person-centred therapy to ensure everyone's needs are met.

We offer in-person, telephone, and online counselling sessions from our site in Northwich, providing a safe and supportive environment for both adults and children

All our counsellors are either fully qualified or completing their training through supervised placements. Each is supported on-site by a qualified professional and designated safeguarding leads, and receives regular supervision from an independent, accredited supervisor to ensure high standards of care.

You don't need to be an APS member to access our adult or children's counselling services, though members benefit from discounted rates.

Adult Counselling Service

We offer one-to-one counselling for:

- Autistic and neurodivergent adults
- Parents, carers, and family members of autistic or neurodivergent individuals

Our Approach

- Person-centred and respectful
- Tailored to meet each client's unique needs

Session Details

- Initial block of 6 sessions, each lasting 50 minutes
- Additional sessions available if further support is needed
- Flexible modality: choose from in-person, telephone, or online
- Sessions are typically weekly, but bi-weekly options are available

Referral Process

- 1.Once a referral is received, the client (or referrer) completes an Adult Assessment Form
- 2. Support is available for anyone who needs help completing the form

Counselling for Children and Young People

We offer one-to-one counselling for children and young people aged 8 to 18, including those who are autistic or neurodivergent.

Our Approach

- Warm, child-focused, and supportive of emotional wellbeing, confidence, and personal development
- Delivered by qualified counsellors, with trainee counsellors available for ages 16 and 17

Session Structure

- Begins with a 'Getting to Know You' session (triage) 25 minutes
- Followed by a block of 10 sessions, each lasting 50 minutes
 Additional sessions can be arranged if further support is need

Introductory Session Details

- Duration: 25 minutes
- Format: In-person or online via Teams
- Focus:

Establishing a dual contract between child and counsellor Identifying therapeutic goals collaboratively

Session Modality

- Flexible: choose from in-person, telephone, or online
- Typically held weekly, with bi-weekly options available

Counselling Pricing

- Standard counselling session: 50 minutes
- Format: In-person or online via teams
- Focus Areas: The client works towards the therapeutic goals identified during the introductory session, which may include areas such as anxiety, self-esteem, emotional regulation, behavioural challenges, family transitions, and more.
