





We currently have a fantastic client who we expect to do well within the Bridge program. Our client, head of St. Irene's family #14, started in August of this year. She has finished her first quarter and signed a new contract for quarter 2. She has welcomed all advice with enthusiasm and has been quick to tackle every goal we set before her.

Her debt repayment is going well. She has paid off all her credit cards. She is on track to have half her student loans paid off by the end of the first year. Through St. Irene's matching program, she will have all student loans paid off at that time. She is actively getting help with therapy for her son of 2 and a half years and herself. She is currently employed full time with benefits. We feel the investment in family #14 is money well spent.

Tie it to the Gospel

- In the Gospel, Jesus is telling the disciples about a day that they will receive a special gift, but they need to "stay awake" to receive it.
- And the gift that Jesus brings, that Jesus wants the disciples to stay awake for is the good news of how we can live God's better way.
- We know that the disciples had to wait for that gift.

Our Mission:

- As a church, the time of the year where we practice "staying awake" to the gift that Jesus brings is called, "Advent."
- Advent means to await and prepare for the arrival of something.
- For the next few weeks, then, we will do things that will help us prepare and get ready to receive the gift of the good news that Jesus brings.
- Because, just like we don't want to sleep through Christmas, we also don't want to sleep through the Good News that Jesus brings and shares with us.

The Four Advent Candles

As a Christian tradition, the wreath holds the four Advent candles. The candles represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness.

One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit. As Christmas draws nearer, each candle brings a little more light into the darkness. Sometimes a white candle is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to symbolize that Jesus is with us. This can be referred to as the "Christ Candle."

Each of the candles lit before Christmas represent an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent.

First Week of Advent - November 30:

- Represents: Hope
- Candle Name: the Prophecy Candle
- Candle Color: Purple which is the primary color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church it symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice.

During the first week of Advent, we remember the Old Testament prophets who foretold of Jesus' coming with hope and anticipation.
