For Andrew Bogusz, faith and family have always come first. As a dedicated altar server, he felt moved with emotion during the Consecration at every Mass he served. Prayerful time spent in the adoration chapel filled him with a profound sense of connection with Jesus. And his devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary played an important role in who he is today.

Throughout his life, people would spontaneously ask him, "Have you ever considered the priesthood?" While others told him what a wonderful priest he'd make one day. Andrew recalled, "In time, I realized that God was speaking to me through others."

When Andrew entered the seminary, it immediately felt like home. "My fellow seminarians are just ordinary guys who absolutely love Jesus and are in touch with who they are and what the Lord wants them to be," said Andrew.

He offered this final thought. "Investing in our next generation of priests is an investment in communion, the sacraments, and the fullness of the ministries the Catholic Church supports. I ask that you pray for the success of the CMAA and blessings to all who support this extraordinary mission."



## Feeding those in need for the glory of God

When it comes to food insecurity, some of the most vulnerable are our senior citizens living on a fixed income or below the poverty line. The SeniorDine program feeds those in need in three ways: Home Delivery, Community Dining in senior centers and churches, and select restaurants in Kankakee, which offer a special menu for its recipients.

Brandon Barrows, Nutrition Program Director, is passionate about this ministry and proud that it nourishes both the body and social soul. "Many of these folks lack social connection and meeting their physical needs along with their social needs is deeply fulfilling," he said. Seeing a smiling face at your door with a hot meal in hand or sharing a healthy meal and good conversation with fellow seniors helps them feel cared for on many levels.

There are over 190 clients enrolled in the program with more than 110 people on the waitlist and the number keeps growing. "The more people we can help stay independent within our community, the better," said Brandon. Together we can make that happen — one plate, and one kind gesture at a time.

The CMAA supports our senior citizens who are in need of nutritious meals and companionship.

# Educating our Catholic school leaders for the glory of God

A Catholic education is a triple blessing. The academic excellence it provides, coupled with the values it instills and life-long friendships it helps create, sets a strong foundation for lives lived deeply in faith. "It's taught in every subject and most especially in the way our teachers and students treat each other and show each other Christ's love."

# Enriching religious education for the glory of God

God calls us to serve in many special ways. This includes those who answer His call to teach the Catholic faith to our children and adults in formation throughout our diocese.

Deacon Anthony Clishem, Catechetical Formation Leader for the Catechesis and Evangelization Ministry for the Diocese of Joliet,



said it best, "Jesus was a teacher and the catechists themselves have a beautiful vocation as teachers who use their gifts to help their students become more like the children of God they are meant to be."

The Catechetical Institute is a valuable resource for training our faith formation leaders, like Lauren Nelson and Kim Kroeze. They lead the religious education program at Holy Spirit Catholic Church in Naperville.

Lauren believes teaching the faith is more than sacramental preparation. "It's preparing our children to be Catholics in the world," she said. Kim feels the training she receives is "spiritual nourishment" that feeds her and in turn, nourishes her students. "The more we grow in faith as catechists, the more we can help them grow their own seeds of faith."



## Catholic Kids Column

In today's Gospel, Jesus visits His disciples' house where Simon's mother-in-law was ill. Jesus immediately healed her. Seeing the wonders of Jesus' healing, other sick villagers were brought to Jesus to be healed physically and spiritually. The next morning, Jesus went off to pray in a secluded place. His disciples followed and told Him that there were others looking for Him.



"Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come. Mark 1:38

Jesus' mission was not to be glorified and worshipped; it was not fame that He was seeking. If He wanted that, He would have gone back to the village after Simon and the others found Him. However, Jesus knew exactly what His purpose was and God's will for Him. His main purpose was to preach for the conversion of sinners. He was not a medicine man who only cured ailments; instead, His physical healings of the sick signify unseen spiritual

healings. That is why Jesus had to preach throughout the whole of Galilee so that He could reach out to as many people as possible, healing them physically and spiritually.

It is easy to be satisfied with your current situation: how you are doing in school, how you are doing at home, the community service or projects you are involved with, etc. As the Gospel portrays, although you are doing great works, you must have your mission in mind and not be satisfied until you have accomplish your goal: God's will for you.




