2022 State of the Parish Report

(cont. from cover) We can aid this through beautifying our worship space, especially the Sanctuary, with Christ being the focus. We are discussing how to bring together the beauty of our baptismal font space and the Sanctuary so that they mirror each other as the Sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist do.

Our faith shines forth when we take care of those around us, providing for their physical needs before we nurture their spiritual need. Jesus always met the needs of those seeking Him before inviting them to follow Him in knowing the joy of God's kingdom. ## Faith Formation

Our Religious Education program is making disciples!
Our catechists are excited to share the Good News with more than 100 children, setting them on fire with the faith and a love of God. They're passionate about their Catholic faith and proclaim the love of God with joy and enthusiasm.

The RE program assists parents in teaching the Catholic faith to their children. As the most important teachers of their children, parents live by example, showing their children how essential God and faith are in daily life. It's important to attend Sunday Mass weekly as a family, pray together daily, and participate in the sacraments often.

We have four baptized young adult candidates preparing to complete their initiation into the Church, and one Catechumen preparing for full initiation though the OCIA process. Our Baptism Preparation Ministry will resume in-person sessions next year.



Small Christian Communities meet weekly, and several adults are completing the diocesan "Be Formed" study.

More opportunities for adult formation will be coming in 2023. In addition to the Lenten Mission, programs focused on the Eucharistic Revival are also in the works.
