Admission Requirements

- Candidates must be **18 years of age and above.**
- All students seeking admissions into AEA must take the **Comprehensive Adult Student Assessment Systems (CASAS) Test.**
- Applicants will equally show proof of their identification including, their residency, Social Security Number/Tax ID, and Driver's License/ ID Card. This is important because of the need to protect the interest of the outside clinical facilities for internship.
