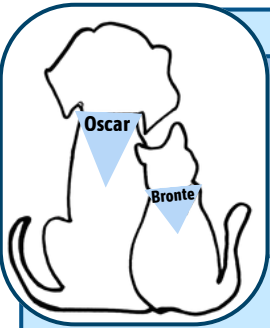

Resident Guide **Wildlife**
Recap: **By-laws**

The Town of Oakville has a by-law in place to prevent conflicts with wildlife from occurring; feeding is one of the main reasons conflicts can arise between people & wildlife. Feeding animals, such as birds, chipmunks, & squirrels, can cause a mess on OSCR property, which is both unhealthy & unsightly. Food left out can attract animals. Coyotes & foxes have been spotted in the area; they may become aggressive, & pose a threat to the OSCR community.

We ask that OSCR residents refrain from feeding wildlife anywhere on the property; we appreciate your co-operation.

Summer Storm Safety Tips

Summer storms can develop rapidly, bringing severe threats such as lightning, damaging winds, and flash flooding. Stay informed of storm hazards by checking weather forecasts before you head out for the day, and read all text alerts that may be sent to your cellphone by Environment Canada.

- When thunder roars, head indoors! At the first sound of thunder, head inside & stay there for at least 30 minutes after the last rumble to ensure the storm has passed
- Avoid showering & using corded electronics during a thunderstorm, as dangerous electrical currents can travel through plumbing and wiring if lightning strikes
- If there is a high wind or tornado warning, move to an interior room, such as your washroom, so that you are not near your window in case it breaks during the storm
- In the event of a power outage at OSCR, there are generators which provide auxiliary power in some public areas and corridors; the red electrical outlets in the hallways receive power during power outages
