#### Three important topics in the prologue: (I John 1:1-4)

#### 1. The \_\_\_\_\_: (v. 1-3)

- 1. "That which was from the beginning"
  - John 1:1-5
  - Jesus was in the beginning with God. (John 1:2; I John 1:2 "and declare to you that eternal life which was with the Father.")
  - Jesus was \_\_\_\_\_\_. (John 1:1,14 "the Word became flesh...")

#### 2. "Which we have seen with our eyes"

- John was an \_\_\_\_\_.
- John knew Jesus well.

#### 3. "Which we have looked upon and our hands have handled"

- "looked upon" describes intense \_\_\_\_\_\_.
- *"handled"* describes the type of physical contact as recorded by John after the resurrection.

#### 4. "That which we have seen and heard"

- John was writing to encourage his readers that Jesus was real, that He indeed was God, and that their faith was not futile.
- "The Word of Life" was "manifested" = \_\_\_\_\_
- John 14:9 "he who has seen Me has seen the Father."

#### Application: Do you know the Word of Life? (I John 5:11-13) Are you declaring the Word of Life to others?

- 2. \_\_\_\_\_: (v.3)
  - 1. John was declaring the Word of Life so that people could experience \_\_\_\_\_\_ fellowship.
  - 2. "fellowship" = Greek "koinonia" = "a joint participation"
    - Carries the idea of communion, sharing, and partnership.
    - Picture "two fellows in a \_\_\_\_\_."

- John's emphasis is first and foremost on having fellowship with God.

# 3. \_\_\_\_\_: (v. 4)

#### 1. John wanted his readers to experience genuine joy.

- "Joy" = Greek "chara" = used to describe both the emotion of happiness or well-being, and a deeper sense of joy and peace, based on faith not circumstances.

- "full" = a picture of a cup being filled to the brim and staying full to the point of overflowing.
