- The original prophecy was spoken by Isaiah. (Isaiah 9:1-2;6-7)

- The promised child was "a great light" because He was (Isaiah 7:14 "Immanuel")
 This was not the first mention of the promise: Genesis 3:15; Genesis 22:8; Exodus 12:13; etc. The entire Old Testament points to the promised Savior.
