7. What are some of the characteristics of someone with **a Shallow Heart?** In this situation, why does the seed not bear fruit?
8. Are the Shallow Hearted and Choked Hearted saved? How do you personally interpret this parable?
9. As you think about your own spiritual growth, what are some things that have helped you grow deeper?
10. What are some of the characteristics of someone with **a Choked Heart?** In this situation, why does the seed not bear fruit?
11. Identify various “thorns” that choke the Word. How can we guard against them?
12. What are some of the characteristics of someone with **a Fruitful Heart?** In this situation, why are there various levels of fruit bearing, 30/60/100 fold?
13. READ John 15:1- 15) What are some practical ways we can improve our fruit production for God's Kingdom? What are some things that will hinder our fruit production?
14. What are some of your biggest takeaways from this parable? How will you apply what you have learned?
