- We should have an attitude of _____ toward others because we are recipients of God's _____.
- When we remember what God has done for us it becomes easier to forgive. If we understand how much we have been forgiven (a debt we could never pay), we should be able to forgive others for far less.

 - o No barriers to the gospel (your story is a powerful example)
 - o No leverage for Satan (anger, grudges, bitterness, etc.)
