



More resources to teach about the Mass!

This is a rough guide, please adjust as needed based on your financial ability. The Catholic Kids Bulletins downloads contain bulletins for all Sunday Masses and Holy Days of Obligation for diocese in the United States. If you live in an area with a Holy Day of Obligation that isn't included, please email me at catholickidsbulletin@outlook.com and I'll try to make it available in future downloads.

Ascension is listed without a date because most diocese move that feast to a Sunday; however, there are a few diocese in which it is a day of obligation. I left it without a date so you could use it on the Thursday or Sunday.

Some days, such as Ash Wednesday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday aren't Holy Days of Obligation, but they are included in the download.

During Lent, there are Sundays (3rd, 4th, and 5th) in which churches can use either the Year C readings or the Year A Scrutinies. Both are included and labeled on the lower left hand corner.

Saint Monica & Saint Augustine




Saint Maximilian Kolbe

Pray to Saint Maximilian Kolbe when you need courage.







There are many liturgical ministers who help during Mass. How are people serving at Mass?




Jesus told His disciples that they should,

Follow the paths from the cross to Heaven. Which one leads to Heaven?






Jesus teaches that we must be strong in our faith! How can you be strong in faith?


