Children's Service Requires Improvement

We were disappointed to read that the recent Ofsted inspection report for Bedford Borough Children's Services showed a decline in standards from the last inspection in 2021. The report was graded 'Requires Improvement' in all areas. The quality of practice and support for the children and families in Bedford Borough has declined under the Conservative administration and the identified shortcomings must be tackled with urgency. We are particularly concerned about the use of unregistered homes for our looked after children, and the lack of oversight of children's placements.

Some other things we are currently working on

Hawk Drive School crossing.

The crossing was closed following a secret traffic survey with less than 24hrs notice, without consultation with the school, parents, parish or borough councillors. We continue to call on the Conservatives to make children's safety a priority. Sadly they have just announced that due to overspending of £14 million no recruitment will take place of staff across the Borough, including school crossing patrols.

Bench at Brickhill Drive Shops.

We are disappointed that it is taking so long for the council to move forward with this which we have agreed to fund

Adoption of Woodlands Park.

The adoption process for Woodlands Park grinds on slowly. We are in frequent contact with the Borough Council to ensure that the developers are encouraged to progress this as quickly as possible.

Secret List of Development Sites. Cllr Vann has seen the list but was told he was not allowed to release it to the public! We oppose the development of the green fields along Ashmead Road.

Council Financial Crisis.

We will oppose the Conservative administration continuing to increase council debt which will result in residents facing decreasing services and higher council tax.

Brickhill Post Office.

Brickhill residents really appreciate the Post Office on Avon Drive and we will continue to campaign for Morrisons to make this a priority.

Kennet Rise.

We are continuing to remind the council of the need for the new school camera enforcement to be progressed as quickly as possible.

Roads and Pavements.

The Conservative administration have stopped the programme of road and pavement resurfacing in Brickhill and things are getting worse. We will continue to campaign for proper funding.

Tree planting.

We have a list of sites for replacement trees and tree maintenance. Please let us know if you have any requests.
