Telephone Mast Applications

Wendy and Charles are pleased that following their objection to the telephone mast on the green opposite Tesco on Brickhill Drive, the application has been refused by Bedford Borough Council. The Planning Application 22/01548/TELPN was for the installation of Fifth Generation (5G) equipment, comprising an H3G street pole and additional equipment cabinets.

The application would have seen more cabinets and a huge new telephone mast on an important green recreation area, only a short distance away from an already existing mast. We believe that telephone companies must work together to use existing sites and stop the proliferation of equipment all over our community. They must also consult with communities before making applications for these new giant masts and not when they have already made up their minds where they want to put them.


We welcome the common sense refusal by Bedford Borough Council in a move which offers protection for one of our valuable green areas.

Pavement Repairs The drought has caused the cracking of pavements around Brickhill where clay has shrunk. We have asked Bedford Borough Council to look at ways of making repairs as quickly as possible, including at this location on Mowsbury Walk.
