Sale of land off Ashmead Road

Disappointment as works are scaled back

We have received the very disappointing news that the council are scaling back the proposed works on Avon Drive. The stretch of Avon Drive between Torridge Rise and Tyne Crescent will no longer be included in the scheme. This road has never received any resurfacing and is in a poor condition. Another outcome of the council bankruptcy is the attempt to raise cash from services such as bin collections. The Conservative administration is consulting on ways to charge for green bin collections and make black bin collections only three weekly. They are also consulting on significant changes to Barkers Lane waste facility. This includes making residents book their time slot before visiting to dispose of their waste and also specify what waste they intend to bring beforehand.

Collecting bins and offering a place for residents to take waste is one of the essential things that residents demand from their council and this is



now under threat. The public response has been overwhelmingly against these charges and Conservatives have started trying to distance themselves from their own consultation process! Protecting Services Cutting Waste

Liberal Democrats have had some success already this year in cutting the waste and vanity projects of this administration preventing cuts to our essential services. However we are still currently spending £450,000 a

year just to maintain the Debenhams building which has no external tenants. The council is now bankrupt with a £14 million overspend and the Mayor will need to go 'cap in hand' to the government for a bailout.

- We stopped proposals to close multi-storey car parks from 10.00pm—6.00am
- We stopped cuts to tree maintenance
- We stopped cuts to winter gritting of roads
- We stopped cuts in grass cutting
- We stopped cuts to street cleansing

For the last two years our warnings to the Mayor about overspending have been ignored. We are worried that as well as the 'fire sale' of our green fields there will be more cuts. Already we have seen future proposals including

- Increased parking charges
- Increased council tax
- Cuts to libraries
- Cuts to grass cutting and maintenance
- Removal of public toilets
