Jesus said to the Pharisees: "There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even used to come and lick his sores. When the poor man died, he was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he cried out, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am suffering torment in these flames.' Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours.' He said, 'Then I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment.' But Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.' He said, 'Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'"

Manda a Lázaró que moje en agua la punta de su dedo y me refresque la lengua, porque me torturan estas llamas'. Pero Abraham le contestó: 'Hijo, recuerda que en tu vida recibiste bienes y Lázaró, en cambio, males. Por eso él goza ahora de consuelo, mientras que tú sufres tormentos. Además, entre ustedes y nosotros se abre un abismo inmenso, que nadie puede cruzar, ni hacia allá ni hacia acá'. El rico insistió: 'Te ruego, entonces, padre Abraham, que mandes a Lázaró a mi casa, pues me quedan allá cinco hermanos, para que les advierta y no acaben también ellos en este lugar de tormentos'. Abraham le dijo: 'Tienen a Moisés y a los profetas; que los escuchen'. Pero el rico replicó: 'No, padre Abraham. Si un muerto va a decírselo, entonces sí se arrepentirán'. Abraham repuso: 'Si no escuchan a Moisés y a los profetas, no harán caso, ni aunque resucite un muerto'".

Day 3 - Saturday, September 27

Presider: The saints had to overcome their natural aversion to the crosses and trials of this life. Francis is no exception. Not only did he have a great fear of lepers, he also had a great loathing for them. He came across a leper, went past him, then he turned around and came back to help him. Who or what are the lepers in our lives. If we can change our response to them we will find that the lepers disappear and only Christ remains.

My sisters and brothers, to your right you will find the annual financial report for you, the parishioners of the Cathedral Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi.

Because of your generosity we can continue to grow many ministries bringing more people into a closer relationship with Christ and his Church. As you know, many visitors come to the Cathedral every day and participate with us in Mass every weekend. From the warm welcome we share with one another, to the beautiful choirs gloriously helping us to join in praising our God, to the ministers and the liturgical environment enhancing our celebration of the Eucharist, we are all incredibly blessed to be an important part of this vibrant active parish.

The youth of all ages in our parish are not only involved in religious education, but many are active in music ministry and assist with volunteer activities especially during the Christmas and Easter Season. The religious education ministry continues to grow as these young people grow closer to Christ in the life of their families.

As you have experienced, we celebrate many baptisms throughout the year, bringing young families into the life of the Cathedral Basilica community. We have also celebrated joyful weddings of many young couples as they choose to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage and become an important part of our community of faith.

You have seen many renovations and restoration projects throughout the year, including the incredibly beautiful new wood floors, the restoration of the pews and the woodwork throughout the Cathedral, the new protective glass on our stained-glass windows and rose window, and the renovation of the confessionals with etched glass images of some of our beloved Saints. All these restoration projects were made possible by designated donations from very generous donors and the *Friends of the Cathedral*. No Sunday collections, which pay for our operating expenses, were used for these projects.

The large surplus in operating income over expenses was possible because of a very generous donation from the estate of long-time faithful parishioners who remembered the Cathedral Basilica in their final estate – we are most grateful and remember them often at Mass and in our prayers.
