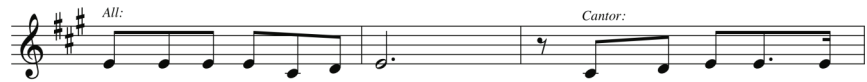

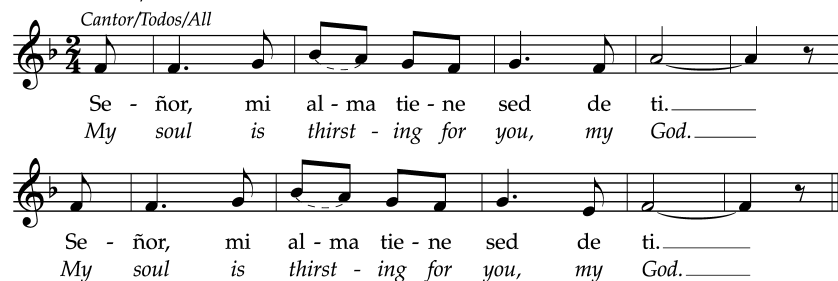
Jeremiah 20: 7-9

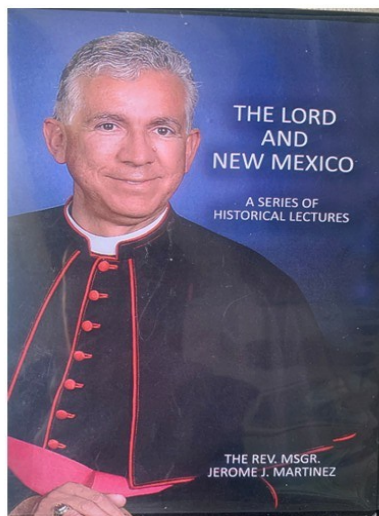

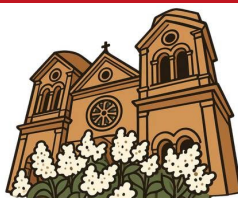
