From the warm welcome we share with one another, to the beautiful choirs gloriously helping us to join in praising our God, to the ministers and the liturgical environment enhancing our celebration of the Eucharist, we are all incredibly blessed to be an important part of this vibrant active parish.

The youth of all ages in our parish are not only involved in religious education, but many are active in music ministry and assist with volunteer activities especially during the Christmas and Easter Season. The religious education ministry continues to grow as these young people grow closer to Christ in the life of their families.

As you have experienced, we celebrate many baptisms throughout the year, bringing young families into the life of the Cathedral Basilica community. We have also celebrated joyful weddings of many young couples as they choose to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage and become an important part of our community of faith.
