Nuestra Señora de la Paz



Shortly before Christmas in the year 1625, Fray Alonso Benavides, Franciscan Superior of the New Mexico Missions, brought a small wooden statue of Mary to the parish church of the Assumption in Santa Fe. Beautifully decorated with bright arabesques over gold leaf, it represented the Assumption of Our Lady. From that day it became an object of admiration to the Spanish colonists and to the Native Americans visiting Santa Fe. Soon it was the focus of a Marian confraternity to which all the colonists belonged.

These devotees dressed her to look like a Spanish Queen, as was the style of those times. Under this costuming the Assumption character disappeared, and the figurine became alive, as it were, to these isolated pioneers who now regarded her not only as the Queen of Heaven but also as “the Queen of the Kingdom of New Mexico and its *Villa de Santa Fe*.” She got her confraternity’s title of Our Lady of the Rosary, but her devotees more often called her “*La Conquistadora*,” because she had come in the days of their founding parents and grandparents, the Spanish Colonists.

In 1680, the Pueblo Indians rebelled, killing twenty-one friars in the missions. Many people of Santa Fe immediately left the city, leaving their possessions behind, but not their Marian Statue. She was saved, although the parish and her shrine were destroyed. The colonists fled to the Guadalupe Mission at *El Paso del Norte* (now Juarez, Mexico). On the outskirts, they built their temporary capital of *San Lorenzo*,

naturally dedicating its chapel to Our Heavenly Patroness.

Late in 1692, under the famed Governor Don Diego De Vargas, the Spanish set out to peacefully resettle Santa Fe, “beneath the protection” of Our Lady. The Governor himself vowed “to rebuild her temple and throne;” if such could be accomplished. The eventual reconciliation between the Native Americans and the Spanish that resulted, has become the reason for the annual Santa Fe Fiestas. It has also produced yet another title for the statue: “Our Lady of Peace,” in 1992. The following year (1694), the colonists began an annual thanksgiving observance by taking *Nuestra Señora de la Paz* from her parish shrine to the encampment site where they had prayed to her for help. A shrine of boughs was erected every year for the event. There a novena of Masses was offered, and then the statue was brought back home in another solemn procession. This, surely, is the oldest Marian festival in the United States of America.

The original shrine, attached to the Assumption parish of 1626 on the east end of the plaza, was destroyed in the Pueblo Revolt of 1680; Governor De Vargas did not live to keep his 1693 promise, but did build a “temporary church of St. Francis” in 1695, “by the north town wall on the road to Tesuque.” This served as the parish church until 1717, when the people finished rebuilding the permanent parish church and shrine on the site of the original structures. But this time the church was dedicated in honor of St. Francis of Assisi. This building was still in use in 1850, when Santa Fe was made a diocese, thus being raised to cathedral status. Archbishop Lamy finished the naves of the present stone cathedral over and around the old adobe structure in 1884, when the latter was pulled down. But the chapel was partially spared, its outer half to this day continues as the cathedral’s chapel to Our Lady.

Nuestra Senora de la Paz has been venerated and feted continuously to this day, not as a miraculous statue as with other more famous shrines, but simply as a long-enduring symbol of a people’s unfailing love.


