Moncks Corner—With Cross High's Caden Ramey's football commitment to a major college scheduled for September, 8, the state of South Carolina will have a record 43 players (for this point in time) committed to major college football teams from the 2026 class within the state!

The *HSSR* always takes a moment to thank **Mark Grainger**, and the fine folks at *Modern Turf* in Irmo and Rembert for their much-appreciated sponsorship of this monthly recruiting page.

In 2025, there were 40 major college signees from the Palmetto State, by the final national signing day in early February. The *HSSR* does not count any player officially committed to a major college until his name shows up on their official commitment list on the respective school's recruiting web site.

"Caden (6-5,200) is going to commit on September, 8th." said **Shaun Wright**, his high school head coach. "It is my understanding that he is choosing between (**South**) **Carolina**, **East Carolina**, **Virginia Tech** and **Syracuse**.

"South Carolina has offered Caden as a tight end, and last year he led the state of South Carolina in interceptions as our free safety with 14, two off the state record," said Coach Wright. "Pierson Prioleau is the safeties coach at Virginia Tech and he has been involved with Caden going back nearly two years. Pierson played at Macedonia back in the 1990's.

"Caden is so long an athletic with great leaping ability," said Coach Wright. "We are playing him at both tight ends, and in the secondary this year. He's

Dillon drops rare season opener vs. Scotland Co.

Dillon—Sometimes teams regroup more from a loss, even going on to compete for championships, and Dillon High head football coach **Kelvin Roller** (42-7) certainly hopes that will the case after the Wildcat's 36-33 loss at **Scot**land County on August, 22.

"Win or lose, you schedule competitive teams like Scotland County to get better and get prepared for the tough teams you have to play in your region, and in the play-offs," said Coach Roller. "The atmosphere for the game, on the road, was also the type environment that prepares your team for some battles to come.

"What I am disappointed about is that we were leading by two touchdowns early in the 4th quarter, got the ball back in good field position, and we just didn't capitalize on our opportunity to put the game away," said Coach Roller. "We need to work on all three phases of the game this week in practice, offense, defense and special teams.

"I can't say enough about the play of **Daniel** Capehart (6-1,195) on both sides of the ball Friday night," said Coach Roller. "He had a long run (59 yards) for a touchdown and on defense he was all over the field making great plays. All I can say is that the colleges are missing out on a great athlete. He deserves a D-! next level opportunity."

Capehart's brother, **Damonte**, is a sixth year DL NFL prospect at **Clemson** this season, so the blood line speaks for itself. Against Scotland County Capehart had 8 tackles as a LB and then he rushed for 74 yards on five carries scoring two rushing TD's.

Coach Roller also cited WR **Zay Robertson** for his outstanding play in the season opener. Robertson had two touchdown pass receptions of 67 and 48 yards and he finished the game with 10 catches for

"North Carolina is getting a playmaker in Zay," said Coach Roller. "His route running is exceptional and he uses his point guard ability in basketball to get away from defenders."

Coach Roller also praised the play of freshman QB **Khayel S. Fong-Talia** (6-2, 208) who was named an *Under Armour Next Level All-American* as an 8th grader on the jayvee team, leading the Wildcats to a perfect 8-0 record. "Despite poor pass protection at times, Khayel still managed to complete 15-of-22 passes for 187 yards and two touchdowns," said Coach Roller. "It was his first game ever on the varsity, playing on the road, in a tough environment and I thought he handled the situation very well."

Dillon scored first against Scotland County when freshman Nibras Harrison scored on a 37-yard run in the first period and a missed PAT gave Dillon a 6-0 lead. Dillon went up 13-7 later in the first when Robertson hauled in a 61-yard pass from Fong-Talia. This time **Jayden Lester** made the PAT to give Dilon a 13-7 lead.

In the second quarter, Dillon scored twice to take a 27-14 lead into the half. Capehart scored on a fouryard run and Lester's PAT made it 21-14. Then Robertson hauled in a 48-yard touchdown pass from Fong-Talia, late in the second quarter, to put the Wildcats up 27-14 at the break.

Early in the fourth quarter, Capehart got loose on a 59-yard tackle breaking touchdown run and the missed PAT gave Dillon a 33-21 lead.


This week Dillon will host **Socastee**, and the Braves were scheduled to play Wando on Monday night due to the game being postponed last Friday due to poor weather.

Younger Wild Gators aiming to excel in 2025

Lake View – In some ways, the 2025 version of the Lake View High varsity football team may resemble more of a junior varsity team.

The Wild Gators lost a bundle of key players off last year's team and many of the players on the field this fall will be a lot younger and less experienced. But don't think for a minute that this year's team will take a step back. Head coach Daryl King realizes there may be a few bumps in the road but the goals remain the same.

"We expect our players to play with effort and get better every week," said King, now in his 17th season as head coach. "As long as the players are playing hard and working every day to improve, we'll be okay. Our goal is to win a state championship."

Lake View opened the 2025 season with a 26-13 win over Marion on Aug. 22. Though far from a perfect outing, it wasn't a bad night for a season opener.

"We know we have some things to overcome, and we made plenty of mistakes, but we saw effort," King said. "We played fast on defense and had a lot of hats on the ball. That's how we have to play, fast. Effort and aggressiveness will make up for a lot."

There are many new faces in new positions this season, none more important than quarterback. The Wild Gators lost three-year starter Kason Herlong to graduation and is turning to senior **Chase Price** this season. Price has been the backup for two years but has not sat idle on the sidelines. The 6-2, 215-pounder was the starting center last season.

"I'm pretty sure that doesn't happen too often but Chase is a good quarterback," King said.

In the win over Marion, Price rushed for 82 yards and two touchdowns on seven carries, and completed 11-of-19 passes for 136 yards and two more touchdowns.

"He looked in control and very comfortable," King said.

The running game will be led by junior **Jalen** Clarke and senior Landon King, who gained 104 vards on seven carries in the opening game.

Leading the receiving corps are **Yuri Richard**son and Anniel Rowland. Richardson had a 60yard touchdown catch against Marion.

""The running backs and receivers have been working hard. Some of them are going both ways so we put a lot on them," King said.

A returning starter along the offensive line is senior guard Farrion Seymore. Junior Alonzo **Hamilton** is the other guard, while freshman Riley McCormick has earned the nod at center. The starting tackles are **Jaden Jones** and **Fin**

"We had some busts that we need to fix but that group work hard," King said. "The key is we have to execute. We have to block and tackle and attack on every snap. We want some of our younger guys to push the starters in practice because building some depth is very important early

Tyree Fore is a senior returning starter at one defensive end while junior Balin Rice is the other end. Working inside at nose are senior Nick Mc-Neil and junior Elijah Paradise.

Returning senior Landon King heads up the linebackers. Freshman Gabe Lee also plays inside with King. The outside backers are junior Terrance Alford and senior Seth Deese, a return ing starter.

Clarke and senior **Bryce King** are the starting safeties, with Rowland and JT Atkinson working at corner.

One area of concern after the first game is penalties. The Wild Gators totaled up 125 yards in penalties.

"We will get that corrected," King said. "Typical first game stuff.

Bamberg-Ehrhardt reloading for another run

Goose Creek – Heading into the 2025 season the Bamberg Ehrhardt Red Raiders are ranked fourth by the HSSR in class A and with 15 starters returning they are again ready to win another region championship along with being one of the favorites in the lower state.

Head coach **Corey Crosby** has his team on a 12-game region winning streak and has averaged 10 wins a year over his three years at the helm of the Red Raider program but it is a new season with high expectations for his veteran squad.

"Our goal is to get to the state championship game," said coach Crosby. "We tell our kids that we don't rebuild, we reload. Every year we have kids that have waited for their chance. Our coaches do a good job of developing young men from 7th grade to where they are at now. A lot of kids are playing the same position since 7th grade. That is one of the keys to our success."

The Red Raiders have seven returning starters on the offensive side of the ball and one player who saw a lot of time last season because of injury. That player is junior quarterback **Brian McMillian** (6'2,185). He led the Red Raiders to a first-round playoff win last season. He is also the starting free safety.

"Brian has done a great job over the summer and we expect big things from him. He is very athletic and gives us another option in the run game," coach Crosby said. Fortunately for McMillian one of the strengths of the team is the receiving corp. The group is led by returning all-state wide out senior **Marcus Cann** (6'2,195). Last season he had over 1400 total yards averaging over 14 yards every time he touched the ball. He will move to running back this season.

Also back are senior Hback **Darius Walker** (5'11,205), **Charles (Anthony) Williams** (5'11,175), and **Jason Youmans** (6'1,180). Walker also starts at linebacker while Williams is at one of the cornerback positions. Last season Walker had 65 tackles and 19 tackles for loss. He has several schools looking at him.

The newcomer to the receiver room is junior **Jordan Bovain** (6'1,170). He transferred from Hampton County where he had 24 receptions for 489 yards and five touchdowns.

The offensive line has three starters returning in seniors, center **Michael Manigault** (6'0,265) and left guard **Jaden Moody** (6'0,255) and junior right tackle **Simeon Bamberg** (5'11,295). Coach Crosby says Manigault is finally health and he is expecting a big season from him.

Junior left tackle **Pierre Fuller** (6'3,275) and sophomore right guard **Aaden McCormick** (6'1,255) are the newcomers to the O-line but like

Goose Creek – The 2024 season was uneven for the Denmark-Olar Vikings in coach William Raysor's first year as they started 1-5 with four of the losses coming against playoff teams but the team did not hang their heads instead they regrouped and finished the year 3-2 including a first-round win over Carvers Bay 22-16.

"Beating Carvers Bay was something for us to build off of going into the off season. We took some things from that game and emphasized them in the off season and pre-season," said coach Raysor.

Coach continued, "We have also emphasized to our team is to 'Learn how to finish.' That doesn't just mean the game but come to workouts during the summer to get in shape, learn how to play both sides of the ball because you never know

when we are going to need you. We have a foundation built now we just need to get better every week."

The Vikings are young with only seven seniors in the starting lineup, four on offense and three on defense. On offense the seniors are quarterback **Tyberrivs Duncan** (6-5,212), wide receiver **Damarcus Wheeler** (6-4,165), right guard **Rahjaneer Singleton** (6-2,288) and center **Kelvarsis Adams** (5-11, 200). Duncan is in his first year as a starter but coach Raysor says he has a strong arm and can make plays with his feet.

Singleton and Adams are the leaders of the offense and will be leaned on to help bring the young players along and to open holes in the running game.

Right Tackle **Mari Moody** (6-4,230) is the third returning starter along the offensive line. The junior has several schools looking at him.

Five sophomores and a freshman round out the starting lineup. **Nyheem Brimfield** (6-4,230) is one of the sophomores. He had an up and down freshmen year but he is athletic and can play several positions. Coach Raysor says he will see time at tight end, quarterback, wide receiver and running back on offense and defen-

Barnwell opens '25 with win over Blackville-Hilda

Barnwell-Any time you graduate a top flight quarterback like Cameron Austin who established new passing records at **Barnwell** over the past three seasons, and play for the AA state title as the Warhorses did last season, you certainly come into the new season wondering and hoping at the same time that the success will continue.

This week Barnwell will travel to Williston-Elko for a non-region contest.

The Warhorses passed the test in week zero with a 22-6 win over Blackville Hilda on August, 21st. It was just two years ago that Barnwell was upset by the Hawks. This time a lot of players in new roles stepped up.

Head football coach, an athletic director Brian Smith begins his third season at Barnwell High. He cited the outstanding effort and play of numerous players after the season opening victory.

"Jackson Bedingfield and Traven Wilson played well in the offensive line," said Coach Smith. "We have to continue to improve if we expect to more down the road. I felt like QB Josiah Gibson did a great throw with both throwing and running also.

"I am also very proud of the way we played on defense," said Coach Smith. "I feel like we have to improve on Special teams.

"We have to develop more depth at the running back position to help make our team better because you are only one injury away from problems," said Coach Smith. "Staying healthy is very important."

Quarterback Josiah Gibson completed 5-of-6 passes for 40 yards in his first varsity start and he did a good job managing the offense for his first

However, the story of the game against Blackville-Hilda was three different running backs pounding out 360 rushing yards on 30 carries which means they averaged 12 yards a carry. You are not going to lose many football games with this kind of rushing totals.

Sophomore running back **Jayden Peeples** led the rushing onslaught with 31 carries for 210 yards and two touchdowns. Senior All-state and all-region running back Nehemiah Brown is back this season and ran 10 times for 64 yards against the Hawks, while

Gibson had seven carries for 48 yards. Marcus Ja**cobs** had one carry for two yards.

The top two receivers for the Warhorses against Blackville-Hilda were junior **Damajhai Devoe** who had four catches for 33 yards. Peeples also had one catch for seven yards.

On defense, Peeples also had one interception and he returned it 41 yards to help set up a touch-

When your running backs get 361 net yards of rushing you have to thanks to the offensive line as well. The leader up-front is Bedingfield, a three starter who is now a senior along with Wilson who holds down the center spot. Carl Hines is the other guard. The two tackles are **Davison Owens** and **Copeland Owens.**

Last season the Barnwell defense gave up only 180 points all season. Allowing only six pints in the season opener is an indication the defense will be strong once again this season despite graduation

Peebles is playing both ways this season and he had 33 tackles as a DB a year ago. Devoe had around 75 tackles last year from the secondary including a team leading four interceptions. **Henri** Creech (6-2,290) is a returning OLB from last season where he had over 50 tackles.

There are numerous new starters on defense this season. The defensive line consists of **Adrian Saxon**, Hines flips from the offensive line, as does Bedingfield. The other outside linebacker joining Creech is **Marcus Jacobs**. Junior **Torye Pickens** (5-9,180) is an inside linebacker,

The secondary consists of corner back Peeples, corner back Vincent Gibson, Devoe and Caiden **Roland** who are twin safeties.

Coach Smith is assisted by defensive line coach Jon Burdge, second year defensive coordinator Isaac Cooper and receivers coach Alan LeRoy. Cody McCollum works with the defensive backs, and Britt Pender mentors the H-backs.

Barnwell High School Principal Derek Youngblood works with the running backs, Dwayne Garrick coaches the offensive line, and Thomas Davis works with the linebackers.

The athletic trainer is **Rob Roth**.

Manning – The Laurence Manning Academy football team picked up a 37-0 victory over John Paul II on August 22 at Billy Chitwood Field in its first game under the guidance of head coach Jimmy

So how did the veteran head coach rate the Swampcats' performance?

"We got off to a bit of a slow start, but we finally put some things together," said Noonan, whose team only led 8-0 after one quarter before expanding the advantage to 30-0 at halftime. "Big plays were escaping us, but we continued to play good defense.

"The offense is far from fine-tuned. We had pretty good offensive numbers but we also had over 100 yards in penalties, some where we had points taken off the board. You can't be having that."

Laurence Manning had 465 yards of total offense, 309 coming via the passing game and 156 on the ground. However, there were 95 yards in penalties.

Junior quarterback **Grainger Powell** paced the Swampcat offense, completing 12 of 15 passes, three of them for touchdowns. He accounted for all of the passing yards.

Noonan only has one complaint in regards to

"He;s the leader of this team, but he's a quiet leader. I wish he was a little more boisterous at times," Noonan said of Powell, who completed 145 of 249 passes for 2,242 yards and 18 touchdowns last season. "He's embraced the offensive philosophy and is showing a lot f consistency inn what we're doing with terminology. His execution of the offense has been good."

Powell spread the wealth, completing passes to five different receiver. Sophomore wide receiver **Scoop Dennis** was his favorite one, connecting with him four times for 121 yards and two touchdowns. He had 37 catches for 478 yards and six touchdowns

Junior tight end Asher Sanders had three catches for 44 yards, sophomore wide receiver **Rob Briggs** had two catches for 92 yards and a touchdown, senior wide receiver **Payton Brown** had two catches for 41 yards and senior wide receiver **Zy Dennis** had one catch for 11 yards.

Zy Dennis was the leading rusher thanks to his one run going 50 yards for a score. Sophomore running back Eli Sandifer had nine carries for 39 yards while Powell had seven carries for 12 yards. Junior running back **Bryce Grubbs** had a 30-yard run, and junior running back Pierson Gamble had three carries for 23 yards.

Tackle numbers were obviously hard to come by with Laurence Manning shutting down John Paul II with regularity. A trio of linebackers led the way.

Gamble led the way with 6 ½ tackles on four solo

MANNING HIGH SCHOOL SOME CONTROLS

Manning looks to maintain last year's success

Manning – When you lose 27 seniors from a high school football team, let alone a AA school, and some of your top players are among that group, adjustments are going to have to be made. And that's what **Manning** is doing.

The Monarchs didn't get off to the best of starts, falling to **Crestwood** 48-14 in the season opener on August 22 at CHS' new on campus facility, **Knight Stadium**. However, there was no panic in the eyes or voice of **Reggie Kennedy**, the Monarchs' veteran head coach.

"We're not going to see a defensive front like the one we saw tonight," Kennedy said of Crestwood, which is a AAAA school. "That front seven for them was really good. The linebackers can run, they were strong, hit the point of attack real well, had some big bodies on the line. We did a pretty good job of controlling the line of scrimmage for most of the night, though. I feel real good, believe it or not. There's a lot of positives for the first time out."

Manning is trying to find a way to make do without **Ja'Rae Mitchell**, a 2-year starter at quarterback, and big play producer **Jeffery Ceasar**. Ceasar was selected as the Region 7 Player of the Year, and he had a tremendous season on offense, defense and special teams.

As a wide receiver, Ceasar had 39 catches for 530 yards and a 13.6 per-catch average. Six of his

catches went for touchdowns and he also had four catches for 2-point conversions. He had 10 carries for 38 yards and two touchdowns.

As a cornerback, Ceasar had seven interceptions, returning two of them for touchdowns, and 172

return yards. He had 41 tackles, three tackles for a loss, seven pass deflections, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

On special teams, Ceasar averaged 34.1 yards on 14 kickoff returns, taking three of them back for touchdowns. Ceasar returned four punts for scores, giving him seven TD returns total. He had 309 yards

on eight punt returns for a 38.6 average.

Ceasar scored touchdowns five different ways – on a run, on a catch, on an interception, on a punt return and on a kickoff return – to finish with 17 touchdowns.

Lovell Stevenson made his first start at quarterback and connected with wide receiver **CJ Robinson** for a couple of long touchdown passes. Kennedy hopes that is a sign of things to come.

"He didn't hurt us," Kennedy said of Stevenson, who completed 6 of 16 passes for 165 yards and the two TD passes to Robinson, who had three caches for 109 yards. "For his first game at quarterback and the kicking duties (Stevenson is the punter and place-kicker), I thought he did a pretty good job. I could rate him a little bit higher I we would have won the game."

Jordyn Thompson will be another receiving target. Manning played the game without its leading rusher on offense and one of its top performers on defense in senior Jontavious Canty. The running back/linebacker has a dislocated hip. He will miss at least all of the Monarchs' non-region schedule.

Canty had 97 tackles, two quarterback sacks, a defensive touchdown and 11 ½ tackles for a loss. Canty picked up 769 yards and nine touchdowns on 112 carries.

The Monarchs return six starters on offense and four of them are on the offensive line. Manning has both of its tackles back with **Isaiah Hamilton** return-

ing on the left side and **Jeremiah Dingle** on the right. Hamilton is a 6-foot-4-inch, 275-pound rising junior while Dingle is a 6-2, 275-pound senior.

Ethan Canty returns as the left guard while **Semja Bush-Rankins** will again be the center.

"We're going to work to run the football," Kennedy said. "I thought our offensive line did a pretty good job overall.

Lovon Stevenson, Lovell's brother, moved to running back after Canty's injury. He was having a good game before being ejected from the game in the second quarter for a pair of unsportsmanlike conduct penalties. He had five carries for 37 yards. Lovon as supposed to be the tight end.

Defensively, the Monarchs have five starters returning, but they will be breaking in a lot of new players. Jontavious Canty and his twin brother,

Dontavious Canty, return at linebacker alongside

Daniel Robinson and Ethan Lowder. Ethan

Morales and Meltwan Smith will be counted on to shore up the defensive front after the loss of Shrine

CJ Robinson and Thompson will again be starting in the secondary.

Bowler Jalynn Coard and Tyler Green.

The Monarchs made it to the lower state championship game and finished with an 11-2 record. They went undefeated at 6-0 in winning the region title. The other teams in the region are **East Clarendon**, **Kingstree**, **Lake City**, **Marion**, **Mullins** and **Atlantic Collegiate Academy**.

Kennedy expects things to be a little bit better when the Monarchs travel down **U.S Highway 301** 10 miles to **Summerton** to face off against fellow **Clarendon County School District** school **Scott's Branch** on August 29

"I did see some bright spots too," he siad. "We got down in the red zone (inside the Crestwood 20-yard line) early twice. One we turned the football over on four downs, then we get it again and we have a mental breakdown, got about 45 yards in penalties. It took us way back. You can't do that against a good football toom.

"It's a learning curve and we've just got to work through it. This game is going to make us a better football team."





"We are pretty talented, but a little inexperienced at a few spots," said Summerville coach Ian Rafferty. "I feel ok we; we just need to get more livegame reps. The **Dorchester County Showdown** was our first chance to get those. I liked the way we performed during the jamboree, but I would like to see us not turn the ball over in the red zone."

The Showdown at **McKissick Field** Aug. 15 was capped by a two-quarter scrimmage between the Fort Dorchester and Summerville varsity teams. The **Green Wave** had a 21-0 lead with just more than four minutes remaining in the final quarter when officials decided to end play due to security reasons related to an off-field incident.

Summerville moved the ball both on the ground and through the air while limiting Fort Dorchester's offensive production.

Junior running back Jayvyn Williams scored on runs of 62 yards and 64 yards and senior running back Cam Grayson also had some nice runs. Summerville's other touchdown came when defensive back Jordan Ravenell intercepted a pass on Fort Dorchester's first possession and returned it approximately 20 yards into the end zone. Summerville kicker Nate Beaver hit three extra-point kicks.

Summerville entered Week 0 of its 2025 campaign with a healthy quarterback competition. Senior Cooper Kafina, who was the backup QB last season, got the start during the jamboree and led the team to victory. Senior Max Stafford, who transferred from Florida, also shows promise behind cen-

Whoever wins the role will have good help in the backfield. Williams returns after rushing for more than 2,000 yards last season. Also back is senior KJ Jenkins, who was injured half of last season but averages approximately five yards per carry. Grayson will split time with them.

Junior receiver Jaiden Kelly-Murray is back and coming off a season that saw him finish with more than 75 receptions and 1,000 receiving yards. He also rushed for more than 200 yards and threw for more than 100 yards. Seniors **ZJ Jenkins** and **Kemori DeWeese** also return with a lot of receiving

Sophomore Teru Davis and juniors Devin Garza and Raymeire Simmons will also lineup as receivers. H-backs **Ethan Woods**, a returning junior, and senior Jack Burnett are also likely to get some touches

"We will do a lot with our H-backs," Rafferty said.

Summerville was senior heavy in the trenches on both sides of the ball last year, but does have some lettermen returning to the offensive line. Returning starters Christian Hewett and Jahmarion Lott are guards. Returning letterman Cameron Thomas and Quinn Cook are tackles. Nolan Giet and Daniel **Krantz** are experienced snappers.

The defensive front was hit harder by graduation. "We are pretty much all new on the defensive line," Rafferty said. "Now at the linebacker positon

we pretty much have everybody back."

Sophomore **Demarcus King** started the last six games as a freshman and will slide from outside linebacker to defensive end. Senior Malachi Washington, a transfer from Goose Creek, will also play on the end. Carson Vaughn, DJ Hall and Peyton **Harrison** will all see a lot of action on the defensive

"Those are three big, strong kids who will be rotating inside," Rafferty said.

The group of outside linebackers will be led by junior Eli Pressley and senior Gryson Greenway. Seniors Tryee Patton and JT Williams are back to lead the inside linebackers. Sophomore **Jaylen Pryor** played a lot as a freshman and will rotate in and out at different spots.

Ravenell, a transfer from Goose Creek, and seniors Josiah Taylor and John Brown will man the cornerback position.

Senior Will Flores has moved from cornerback to safety. Junior Ja'kayden Pendergrass, who played a lot last season, and senior Jayden Worilds will also anchor the position group.

Bryce O'Rear is back as long snapper. His brother, Hayden O'Rear, is the punter. Beaver is the kicker and backup punter. Summerville has multiple options when it comes to kick returners.

"Our coaching staff returns intact and we have the pieces," Rafferty said. "Most of the players who are stepping into a starting role got to play a little last year, but it wasn't at those critical times. It was when the lead was pretty much in hand so I'm interested to see what they do in those critical situations.

"They both sat behind Ryan Campbell last year or either one of them could have been a 1,000-yard rusher," Lorenzano said. "Every time I put them in the game they had positive yards."

Junior H-back **Ryan Simmons** is expected to make an impact during his first season of varsity football.

"I think we have one of the best groups of receivers around here," Lorenzano said. "They are all

humble, talented and hungry. They will play big roles this year."

Sophomore slot receiver **Derrick Simpson** and wide out Laurez Matthews are expected to have a lot of touches. Junior Caiden Gant (6-3, 210) and sophomores Zaire Warren and Devin Gates will also see time at receiver.

The offensive line will be anchored by a pair of senior returning starters. William Martray is back at center and **Zyion Rouse** is back at left tackle.

Senior returning starter Thomas Wamer and sophomore **Kasamania Milo** will lineup on opposite ends of the defensive line. Sophomore Reginald Edwards (6-4, 325) provides good size in the middle of the D line.

"We will have some young guys battling for playing time up front, but that group should really shine," Lorenzano said. "I also like our linebacking corps. Senior Savon Garrett is a mainstay who already has a couple of college offers. Senior Miguel **Pearson** has really came into his own with drops and coverages. He was super physical this spring."

Josiah Singleton is one of the new linebackers expected to make an impact.

Amari Dawson, a sophomore transfer from North Carolina, and returning senior Jeff Jefferson are leading the way for the team's group of cornerbacks. Jefferson started a couple of games last year and was a standout on special teams.

Sharks pound out 385 rushing yards in 37-8 victory over Airport in season opener

Bluffton—The Slot T offense is alive and well at May River High for the 2025 season, and so is the team's continued success, as the Sharks dominated **Airport** 37-8 win in week

On the bus ride to **Airport High** last week, to start the 2025 football season, head coach Richard Bonneville wondered to himself how all the graduation losses from last year's break through 9-3 team might hurt the Shark's chances to keep the winning ways alive.

"Honesty, we had had three scrimmages against really good teams like **Ashley Ridge** and Hampton County and then Wilson High totally dominated us in a jamboree," said Coach Bonneville. "As a coaching staff we were concerned. We had three starters back on offense and three players on defense who had started some during last season so we were on our way for our first game of the season loaded down with a lot of first-time starters. We had no idea what type team we were about to see play their first game of the season."

To make worse, none of the officials had ever worked a game against the complex schemes one sees executed out of the slot T. "It is legal for our wing backs to run backwards" said Coach Bonneville. "I sensed we might have procedure penalties after my talk with the officials in the pre-game meeting."

Despite being flagged 20 times, mainly for what was perceived as procedure issues, May River survived the officiating, and a one-hour lightning delay, to rack up 385 rushing yards on 44 carries producing four rushing touchdowns.

The Sharks were led on the ground by senior running back **Andrew Johnson** (6-1,185) who had 139 yards on 15 carries scoring two rushing touchdowns on the night. May River quarterback **Luc Trent** threw only one pass all game

but it was a 14-yard touchdown reception to

Senior running back Sean Mitchell (6-1, 185) also had a good night gaining 91 yards on 15 carries and he also added two rushing touchdowns. Junior fullback Tracy Cooper (5-7,160) added 90 yards on 8 carries and Tran chipped in with 41 yards on four carries after not running the ball much in the three prior scrimmages.

"I am very proud of how our offense moves the ball, despite the penalties that could have hurt our momentum," said Coach Bonneville. "However, our defense was lights out and I got to tell you, we had a new sophomore starter named **Michael Poole** (6-3, 185) play the game of his life. He was on our jayvee last year and on the opening kick-off to them to start the game he made a jaw stopping tackle that set the tone for our defense the rest of the game.

"Before this season is over his name is going to appear on a ton of college recruiting lists trust me," said Coach Bonneville. "He is a sideto -side linebacker who just has a gift for knowing where the ball is going."

Cooper had 13 tackles, two TFL, and two sacks on the night against Airport. Other defenders on the tackle index were junior LB **Mason Campbell** (6-0,175) with six tackles and senior OLB Devin Ryan had six tackles and two sacks. Senior DL Zavier Polite (6-3,175), ILB **Brayden Harris** (5-9,170), senior DL Charlie Crace, and SAF Jackson Miller (6-1, 175) all had four tackles for the Sharks.

Other defensive starters for May River against Airport included Elijah Yeager (5-10,285) at nose guard, and sophomore DB **Ryan Paylor** made his first varsity start in the secondary. Sophomore **Falco Kelly** (6-3, 245) started in the DL as well. LB Henry Santiz (6-0,175) missed the game with an injury but he is expected back real soon.

sophomore **Justin Head** (5-10,165) who is a boundary corner back. Junior Mason Sweigart (5-10,155) is a CB and Ethan Seabrook (6-0,165) is also a CB.

"Six out of seven of our offensive linemen had not started in a varsity football game until this past game," said Coach Bonneville. "Our junior strong tackle is Ethan Hames (6-5,285) and he will be a big-time recruit as well before the season is over. He is a road grader once the ball is snapped."

Another offensive lineman contributing include: Senior SG Cam Jordan (6-0,225), junior OG Jayden Page (6-0,240), junior OT Leo Naser (6-3,255), junior C Jacob Dosher (6-2, 245), and senior OL Seran Zadroga (6-1, 235). The swing man is senior Chris Beckman (6-3,

In the slot T offense, which is very popular in the state of Texas, you have to get use to different terminology. "We just put this offense in last year and we are much more comfortable with it the more we run it," said Coach Bonneville. "In practice we will work against five or six different defensive schemes because opponents you so may strategies in trying to stop the slot T. It helped us win 9 games last year.

"In the slot T average athletes can get involved and if they execute correctly, you can be a lot of a team with superior talent," said Coach Bonneville. "We play some teams who don't have a clue how to stop the Slot T. We are the only team running this type of complex offense in the state as far as we know."

May River has continued to practice at 6 a.m. in the morning Monday through Thursday throughout the season starting with the very first day of practice. "We don't worry about afternoon thunder storms, or temperatures at 100 degrees," said Coach Bonneville. "Our players love the 6 a.m. practices and we think it gives us a discipline and focus some teams we play

"Our team is loaded up with sophomores and juniors," said Coach Bonneville. "Our goal is to win at least six games with so many young players on the term this season. But watch out for the next two years when these players become juniors and seniors. We are building something special with this group this season.

"our scheme we run we keep us competitive," said Coach Bonneville. "The longer we tun it the more comfortable we get with it."

May River's place kicker is senior **Hudson Tanner** and the place kicker is senior **Erik** Robertello who made 4-of-4 on PAT's against Airport.

From B-Team to new JV program, Griffins just one year away from fielding varsity team

Spartanburg—In 2026, Spartanburg Day will complete a three -year plan to grow from a "B" team football program into a competitive varsity football program by 2026, and head coach Patrick Moffitt has been very busy over the past year working towards those goals and objectives.

"Our goals are to continue to grow as a team and build a competitive atmosphere within the program," said Coach Moffitt. "We have a lot of guys who are new to football, so putting them in situations where they can learn the game and build their football IQ is a major objective.

"We are building for the future and they understand that everything they do every day is going to help them get to where we want to be once we are a varsity program next season," said Coach Moffitt. "Our realistic goals are to continue to develop in the fundamentals of the game and have a good understanding of what we are doing and why we are

This season, Spartanburg Day is growing into a junior varsity football program. There are currently 16 players on the junior varsity while the middle school team has 18 players.

The junior varsity team consists of 8th grade quarterback **Rutledge Wall**, 9th grade running back **Bennett Johnson**, and 9th grade wide receivers Charles Wilson, Tyler Fernandez, and Camden **Teal**. Wall was a speedy free safety on the "B" last year who had 12 tackles including two TF. "In our first loss to Christ Church the final score was 44-24, and in the final game of the season against them, we lost 68-36, and I felt like we improved with every practice and every game," re-

Coach Moffitt was surprised with how much the community, and school supported the "B" team last season and he hopes the enthusiasm continues for the junior varsity football program. "We averaged between 300 and 500 fans a game," said Coach Moffitt. "The upper high school students at Spartanburg Day came to all our home games and cheered us on. You could certainly tell there was a lot of interest and support for football at our school."

Coach Moffitt came to the Spartanburg Day School from the **St. Andrews School** in Delaware. When Coach Moffitt took over the program at the St. Andrews School, in 2015, the school had only 21 varsity players, and they had not made the playoffs in a number of years. When he left the program, after the 2023 season, to come to Spartanburg Day, his team had 49 players, and they were consistently in the play-offs.

Coach Moffitt was a college quarterback at Williams College in Massachusetts where he gradu-

> ated in 2011. During his fouryear career the Ephs were 20-4. After his senior season he won the Golden Helmet Award in New England for all Div. II and III players in the region.

Coach Moffitt is very excited about his challenge of building the Spartanburg Day School football program from the ground-up. "I am not sure about the exact year, but the Spartanburg Day School last had a football program in the early 1980's," said Coach Moffitt. "We were not exactly sure what to expect in our first season bringing football back to the school.

Gaffney focused on fundamentals after loss in opener

Gaffney—Nothing in the world would have made Donnie Littlejohn prouder then to have won his first game at home, as the new head coach of the Gaffney Indians, in the '25 season opener against Independence of Charlotte last week.

After-all he was now the head coach at his alma mater, where he was once a star offensive lineman before going on to star at **Furman**, and he had spent the last two decades as the

offensive coordinator for the Indians before being named the new coach following Dan Jone's retirement after last season.

"We need a strong week of practice this week working on fundamentals of offense, defense and special teams, to get ready to play JL Mann this week," said Coach Littlejohn. "Our former defensive coordinator **Bryce Smiley** is the new head coach at Mann. Coach Smiley knows a lot about us and we know a lot about what style of defense we have to prepare for this week. It will be a challenging game and we need a good week of practice to get ready to play much better this week."

One matter of great concern to Coach Littlejohn was the Gaffney special teams punt unit giving up a 70- yard return for a touchdown with three minutes to go in the game that broke a 21-21 tie to give Independence a hard-fought six- point win. "Our goal is not to have that happen to us again this season, said Coach Littlejohn. "We will certainly work on covering punts better this week in practice."

Against Independence Gaffney led 14-7 after the first period. RB **Jaiden McDowell** capped off a six play 62-yard drive with a 9-yard touchdown run with 6:29 left in the opening period and **Alessandra Santana's** PAT tied the score at 7.

Later in the first period, Gaffney took a 14-7 lead when quarterback Banks Bouton scored on a three-yard run with 5:23 left in the opening period. Santana added the PAT to make it 14-7.

Then with three minutes to go in the second quarter Bouton tossed a 27- yard scoring pass to Josiah Hill and the PAT tied the score at 21 all at the half. Gaffney would not score again in the game.

"The real disappointment last week was our offense being shut-out in the second half after we scored 21 points in the first half," said Coach Littlejohn. "Our top running back **Jaiden McDowell** got injured in the third quarter and did not return to the game. We will not know the extent of his injury until he goes to the doctor on Monday.

"We have to get our passing game going," said Coach Littlejohn. "Right now, our two quarterbacks, **Jayvon Gilmore** and **Banks Bouton** are sharing equal reps in practice."

Against Independence, Gilmore was 5-of-13 for 57 yards while Bouton was 2-of-5 for 43 yards. Gilmore is a four-star rated quarterback committed to **Arkansas**. Bouton passed for over 2,500 yards last year at **Greenville** High and he transferred to Gaffney after last season.

Hill was the leading receiver for Gaffney in the game with four catches for 42 yards and one TD. McDowell, who is committed to **Mercer**, rushed for 17 yards on five carries before getting hurt. McDowell also caught three passes for 24 yards. Brady Smith and Shun'derious Roges each had one catch each.

For the game the stout Independence defense limited Gaffney to just 53 net yards rushing on 21 carries and they allowed Gaffney quarterbacks to complete only 7-of-18 passes for 100 yards.

The Gaffney defense was led by senior East Carolina LB commitment Zyon Ratchford who had 10 solo tackles and one assist. Highly regarded DB Zion Dawkins had seven tackles DB Adreyan Monroe had 8 tackles, and LB Ty McGil chipped with five tackles. Jeronte Kimbrough was next on the tackle index with four stops along with DL Jaleel Tate who also had had four tackles. Tate and Kendaris Bailey had one sack each.

"If we lose McDowell for a few games, we have confidence in our number two running back **Dominic Odom** (5-11, 195," said Coach Littlejohn. "We will put him in the fold at either H-back or tailback.

"Independence loaded up the box against us because we ran the ball very well in our three scrimmages in the pre-season," said Coach Littlejohn. "Getting our passing game going should help our running game because it might loosen up the defenses, we face some."

Coach Littlejohn cited the play of LT **Scotland Dover** and RT **TJ Brooks** for their above average play in the offensive line versus Independence, along with starting center **Cam Shippy**. Dover is a pledge to **Appalachian State**.

"We are looking forward to a great week of preparation and to work on being a more fundamentally sound football team, in all three phases of the game by this Friday night," said Coach Littlejohn. "We are capable of playing much better and hopefully we will."



Reitenour believes Raiders will be improved

Blackville – Jefferson Davis Academy lost a load of talented football players to graduation from last year's squad that went 11-2 and lost in the semifinals of the SCISA 8-man state playoffs after winning the title in 2023. That, however, doesn't deter Raiders head coach **Anthony Reitenour** from believing his squad can be right back in the mix for a title come

"This team is as good as any team I've coached since I've been here," said Reitenour, who is off to a 1-1 start in his fourth season. "We're still figuring out the right formula, the best fits at every position. With guys who have transferred in or have come up from the junior varsity, we've got a lot of guys who are new to the system on varsity. There have been plenty of growing pains but I'm seeing progression.

"I like where we are, and there are a lot of things to improve on. I feel like 8-man is pretty wide open this year. There is no clearcut, dominant program. It should be a good, competitive year, and I think we can be in those talks at the end of the year as much as anybody else."

Jefferson Davis is having to replace its entire offensive backfield in quarterback Colson Loadholt and running backs Nasir Void and James Grubbs. Loadholt rushed for 769 yards and 15 touchdowns on 83 carries while completing 14 of 37 passes for 374 yards and six scores. Grubbs rushed for 1,120 yards and 11 touchdowns on 150 carries, while Void rushed or 1079 yards and 15 touchdowns on 132 carries. That's 43 rushing touchdowns and 32 yards shy of 3,000 that need to be replaced.

The Raiders opened the season with a 38-8 loss to Providence Athletic Club, a home school team out of the **Columbia** area, on August 15. They bounced back with a 52-6 triumph over **Cross Schools** on Au-

Senior **Dalton Nix** is the starting quarterback. He threw just three passes last season, but completed all of them for 29 yards and a score. Nix rushed for 197 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries.

Reitenour hopes Nix can step up and take control of the position this year.

"I think he had first-game jitters against PAC, but he bounced back and had a good week of practice and played well against Cross," Reitenour said. "There are things he needs to improve on and fix. We need him to step up and be the man. He wants it, he works hard, and he wants to step up and do it. Hope-

As for running back, newcomer Gregory Lihan was listed as the starter. However, he suffered a dislocated elbow against Cross Schools and will likely miss a few games. Lihan ran for three touchdowns in

Ray will also see time at wide receiver along with junior Reece Still, whom Reitenour calls the best athlete on the team. Offensively, Still had a team high seven receptions for 209 yards and two scores last season, and he also ran for three TDs.

"We've got to find a way to get him the ball," Reitenour said of Still. "He's the most athletic playmaker I have. I need him touchdown the ball eight to 10 times a game. I think he only touched it three times against Cross. He's the guy this year, and we need him stepping up big time. I've got to find creative ways to get the ball in his hands for sure."

Senior Landon Williams – no longer Little Landon following the graduation of Big Landon Williams — is the starting tight end. Two of the three offensive linemen return in left tackle Fischer Robinson and center Bryson Livingston. The right tackle is Davison Owens.





Just like on offense, the Stallions return eight starters on defense. That includes all four linebackers in their 3-4 look.



Myrtle Beach – The Myrtle Beach Seahawks football program had a successful move from one of the toughest AAAA regions into Class AAAAA in 2024, creating high expectations for 2025.

Last season produced a 6-5 overall record and 4-1 mark in region 6-AAAAA. The lone region loss came to Carolina Forest. Myrtle Beach lost to White Knoll in their playoff game.



Hammond not focused on championship in 2025

Columbia - The Hammond football roster looks a lot different than it did in previous seasons, and with that difference comes a different outlook on how the team will come together.

Gone are more than 30 seniors and many starters on both sides of the football. In their place are 22 juniors, 20 sophomores, and only nine seniors

"We're inexperienced," said head coach Jon Wheeler, in his fourth season as head coach. "We're junior-heavy, but we've had a good summer for the most part. The guys are committed."

The experience quotient is unavoidable for the Skyhawks, who have won 22 state football championships, including eight straight state crowns since 2017. The focus is on getting better every day. We're not going to emphasize competing for a championship a ton, we're just talking about getting better. Every once in a while I'll throw it (the championships) out there to get them motivated, but we don't talk about it otherwise. You can't control when you play for championships, you can't control your opponents."

Wheeler, who is deeply embedded in the Hammond culture since his days as an assistant to head coach Erik Kimrey, has an experienced staff that includes Athletic Director and offensive line coach Jeff Barnes, defensive coordinator Hamp Smith and offensive coordinator Rick Reetz. These coaches all have the understanding that the 2025 Skyhawks need experience and need to learn how to fight through adversity

Hammond returns only three offensive starters, linemen Jaliyl Jaminson, Jauris Shaw, and Walter Cason. Rising senior Daylin Haltiwanger transferred to Orangeburg-Wilkinson in the offseason.





In addition to a lot of new faces on the field, the Chiefs will have a new look schematically on both sides of the ball this fall. 





Brooks Smith era begins for Orangeburg Prep

Orangeburg – Orangeburg Preparatory School
has a new head coach for its football program in
Brooks Smith. Outside of the change in job title,
that's about the only thing new in regards to Smith.

Smith is a graduate of the school and has been teaching and coaching at the school for the past several years. He moved into the top spot after serving as the offensive coordinator for **Don Shelley**, who retired after two seasons in his second tenure at the school.

"There really hasn't been much that has changed," Smith said. "Offensively, we're keeping things pretty much the same in the transition to what we're doing. We will have some people getting more rep(etition)s.

"We've got a pretty good coaching staff in place. They've all been doing this for a pretty long time."

Smith takes over a team that went 5-6 last season, losing to defending AA state runner-up **Bethesda Academy** in the first round of the SCISA AA state playoffs. Heading into the season, which began on August 22 with a 42-14 home loss to defending AAA state runner-up **Wilson Hall**, Smith was pleased with the Indians' preseason preparations.

"I've been very pleased with the effort," he said.
"The hustle and the effort has been there. We were still learning to grasp a new defensive system. When they learn where to be, they'll run it faster. Still, we've come a long way.

"We've been talking about sticking together," Smith added. "We've preached accountability to our players, how they need to hold themselves accountable. Once we do that, I think we'll be a pretty tough out for anybody."

Orangeburg Prep has a Football Bowl Subdivision commitment returning in wide receiver/defensive back Tilden "T" Riley. The 6-foot-5-inch senior had a breakout season last year and started garnering a number of offers. He recently committed to Power 4 Conference school Vanderbilt of the Southeastern Conference.

Smith said one of the big offseason goals for the coaching staff was to make use of Riley in a way that helps the entire offensive unit.

"Obviously we know we want to get the football in his hands as much as possible," Smith said of Riley, who had 44 catches for 788 yards and 13 touchdowns. "We know his strengths and abilities. We're working on our run game where they help each other. We've got two starters back."

Those starters are senior **J'Syri Parker** and senior **Ger'maurey Robinson**. Parker was the leading rusher with 475 yards and eight touchdowns on 97 carries

The Indians will have a new quarterback as sophomore **Cholly Williams** takes over for the graduated **Walt Mims**. Smith is pleased with the progress that Williams has made.

"He has a really good grasp of the offense and what we're trying to do," Smith said of Williams, who will have junior **Max Judy** as his other starting wide receiver and junior **Marshall Livingston** at

end. "We're pleased, but he still is a sophomore who is in his first year on the varsity.

"He's a headsy guy who can make something out of nothing, turn a negative into a positive. He's a smart kid who makes sure everybody gets in the right spot. He's a very quick learner."

Orangeburg Prep does have experience back on the offensive line with four returning starters. They are senior left tackle **Stevein Sonny** (6-0, 280 pounds), senior right tackle **Jonathan Marcellana** (5-10, 205), senior right guard **James Williams** (5-10, 180) and junior center **Thomas Fanning** (6-1, 255). The only newcomer to the line is senior left guard **Mac Strickland** (6-0, 200).

"We've been coming along pretty well on the offensive line," Smith said. "We've got some freshmen and sophomores who are going to be in there getting reps as backups. We're hoping to have a healthy offensive line where we can control the game with our run game"

While the Indians have seven returning starters on offense, they don't have nearly as much experience on the defensive side of the ball with just two starters back. They are James Williams and Robinson, both of whom are starting at linebacker.

The other two linebackers are Strickland and junior **Blake Inabinet**. Sonny and Marcellana will be joined on the defensive front by junior **Parker Gray**. Joining Riley in the secondary will be Cholly Williams, Judy and sophomore **Council Burroughs**.

Smith said Orangeburg Prep will be changing up its approach as to what it does defensively.

"We're still going to be working out of a 3-4 scheme," he said. "The way we call it will be a bit different. Some of the things we do coverage-wise will be a little different. When healthy our secondary is very good. The safeties are good athletes. The line-backer corps is pretty solid. We've just got to make sure they stay healthy. On the defensive line we're breaking in some new people."

Cholly Williams will be the placekicker while Marcellana will handle the punting duties.

Orangeburg Prep will again be part of the 6-team

The 6-foot-4-inch, 300-pound Vaughan is a monster on both sides of the ball. He played 15 snaps on offense against Newberry and had eight knockdown blocks. He led the defense with 125 tackles last season, including an amazing 44 ½ tackles. He had 7 ½ quarterback sacks, caused six fumbles and recovered three fumbles.

"I think he's the best lineman in 8-man football," Doolittle said.

Vaughan and John Walters are the tackles on defense. Whittaker and freshman **Eli Gossett** are the outside linebackers with Hardy and Bell roaming on the inside. Cooper and freshman **Elias Littleton** are the defensive backs.

Doolittle believes the best is yet to come for the Crusaders.


"There's just a lot of areas on the team where we can and will get better at," he said. We're always chasing for our best. I don't believe it was our best against Newberry. I do believe can get better."



Gray Collegiate football is locked in on this fall

Gray Collegiate Academy's 2024 season was, to put it bluntly, a disappointment.

Because of a player ineligibility issue, the team was banned from the postseason and forfeited all seven of its wins in the War Eagles' first year competing in the 4A classification.

The message about last year that Gray leadership and second-year head coach **De'Angelo Bryant** have for this years football team?

Forget about it.

"I think that anytime you have something of that nature in the program, you have to put it behind you," Bryant said. "It's not our main thought. This is a new season, a new year, we have new opponents for our team to teach them about the legacy at Gray. We're going to move forward and play some great football."

There's no worry if Gray can turn the corner this season. The War Eagles lost just 13 seniors from last year and have 18 seniors on this year's team.

"A handful of those guys are third-year starters and they're experienced champions," Bryant said. "This senior class is a very strong class. They're a great group of guys, and that helps when you have kids who have the opportunity to play at the next level on your team now."

Quarterback **Tyler Waller** (1,038 passing yards, 11 touchdowns; 419 rushing yards, 4 TDs) is one of those 3-year starters. Backing him up is sophomore **Xavier Wright**, whom Bryant said has a lot of potential.

Gray has two breakout running backs, senior **Nate**

Dixon, who backed up 1,000-yard rusher **D.J. Montgomery** last year and averaged seven yards a carry, and junior and **Gilbert** transfer **Trevon Williamson**.

"He's been very productive in his career," Bryant said of **Williamson**, the son of former South Carolina receiver **Troy Williamson**.

The receiver corps Bryant considers is the most talented in the state. Senior **Hiszari Gantt** leads the group.

"He's a speedster," Bryant said of Gantt, who had 29 catches for 318 yards and two touchdowns last year. "He can get deep on you really fast, and he can make you miss in a phone booth."

Kaleb Barry, who had 15 catches for 266 yards and five scores, is another top receiver who finished the season scoring touchdowns in five out of the last six games. Junior Corey Gleaton, who had a couple of catches for 26 yards last year, will more than likely get many more targets this year. Another son of Troy Williamson, junior Royce Williamson, is what Bryant considers a Swiss Army Knife, a player who can run any route, line up as a running back, and do whatever is needed on any given down.

Gray's losses from last year affected the offensive and defensive lines the most.

Senior and 3-year starter **Jack Armstrong** returns to anchor both lines. On the defensive line, Bryant felt the loss of four top linemen, three of whom signed to play in college.

"That speaks to the talent level we lost, but (senior) **Dawson Peake** was in the rotation last year and (senior) **Kaleb Holmes** as well, and another player I really like

The Eagles will be back in SCISA 8-man league this season. They were in the 8-man league before


from 2018-2021 and complied a record of 29-13 including the best record in school history as they went 10-1 in 2020.

Dorchester—Woodland did not start the regular season in week zero, but they were preparing for the start of their season against **Colleton County** this week by having a knock-down drag out physical scrimmage against Batesburg-Leesville last Friday night.

Coach Ford is starting year six as the head coach at Woodland High. He has 27 years of total coaching experience and he is a graduate of Bamberg-Ehrhardt High School.

"We found out in our scrimmage against Batesburg-Leesville that we have a lot of growing up to do," said head coach Eddie Ford. "We were not following our schemes very well at all. Batesburg has a really good football team.

"We also played Ashley Ridge in the Dorchester County Jamboree, so we probably scrimmaged against the best two running backs in the state, against the Wooden kid at Batesburg and Ryan Campbell at Ashley Ridge," said Coach Ford. "They were two physical scrimmages and it should have prepared us when we start the season with Colleton County this week.

"We also competed in a three-way scrimmage against Hilton Head, Saluda and Silver Bluff to get better prepared for the season," said Coach Ford. "Our goals are to compete for a region title find a way to get past the second round of the play-offs. We have avoided injuries in the pre-season and I feel like we have the potential to have an outstanding season."

Woodland was 7-4 last season.



Week Zero football results and such in the Midlands

Columbia - In spite of delays and postponements because of lightning and thunderstorms in the area last week, Midlands football teams kicked off the 2025 season in the truest fashion—games that may not have been sensational but offered a lot of game experience.

Besides postponed games recapped below, **Gray Collegiate's** game at **James Island** was postponed for Monday. Defending 5A Division 1 champion **Dutch Fork**, which opens the season against **Spartanburg** Friday, had an open date, as did **Batesburg-Leesville**, which opens the season at home against **Wagener-Salley**.

Camden at White Knoll

One of the standout games of the week was the battle between **Camden** and **White Knoll**. The Timberwolves beat Camden 21-14 in the season opener last year at the Bulldogs' Zemp Stadium. On Thursday—and Friday—the game played out at White Knoll's field emblazoned with "The Bank" at midfield to acknowledge the town of Red Bank. At the finish, Camden clinched a 20-7 win.

"I'm really proud of the guys for fighting against a really good team," Camden head coach **Brian Rimpf** said. "This is a great program Pelham's got. This was a hard-fought game last year and it was the same kind of ending except they scored at the end to win. I'm proud of the guys for coming back this year and getting it done for us."

White Knoll head coach Nick Pelham, not concerned about the loss, was beaming because he saw his players respond well to Camden's toughness, and play better in the second half.

"I really love playing Camden. I hope we can keep it going," Pelham said. "They're really well-coached, they're really tough, they hit, they've got really good talent. We've had two great games with them. Coach Rimpf is an awesome coach and awesome guy, their assistants are great. I hope we can continue this."

The Bulldogs scored two touch-downs—quarterback **Grayson Rimpf** running from one yard out and a Rimpf-to-**Bernard Green** touchdown pass 26 seconds before the half—to take a 13-0 lead on the Timberwolves at intermission. White Knoll turned over the ball four times in the first two quarters.

The game was called during halftime because of lightning in the area.

Play resumed Friday at 7 p.m. As the game continued, it was obvious that both teams had learned from their mistakes 24 hours earlier.

White Knoll didn't lose the football, firstly. The Timberwolves got on the scoreboard following a 66-yard drive capped with quarterback **Jhais McK-eever's** 4-yard touchdown run with 48 seconds left in the third quarter.

After that score, Camden sustained two clock-burning drives, one of which

resulted in a second Rimpf touchdown run, this time from eight yards out with 1:24 left. White Knoll took over and drove to midfield, but turned the ball over on downs.

Bulldogs running back **Navier Boykin** rushed 15 times for 66 yards in the second half to power those drives.

The game fell into the loss column for the Timberwolves, but Pelham said he felt great about the action he saw, especially in the growth of the team overnight that was demonstrated in Friday's portion of the game.

"We talked about how lucky we were," Pelham said about coming back to the game. "because very few times in life do you make a mistake when you're doing something, and you get a retry the next day. You get a day to take a breath, see what you did wrong, reassess, change some things and go do it better. I'm glad we got that."

White Knoll travels to **Sumter** and Camden plays host to **Lugoff-Elgin** Friday.

Just as the Camden-White Knoll game was suspended till Friday night, so too was **Lexington's** rivalry game at **Gilbert**.



just a great athlete with a strong work ethic."

What is likely driving the numbers up is the fact that major colleges can now have 105 total football scholarships, an increase of 20 over the previous cap of 85. The transfer portal does not seem to be hurting the numbers at all in South Carolina, like they have in some states.

To date here is a break-down on the major colleges who have commitments from in-state players and the number they have committed. South Carolina (6), East Carolina (4), Appalachian State (4). Liberty (3), UNC Charlotte (3), Arkansas (2), North Carolina (2), Navy (2), NC State (2), Clemson (1), Florida (1), Michigan (1), Michigan State (1), Duke (1), Texas A & M (1), Memphis (1), Duke (1), Wake Forest (1), Texas A&M (1), Coastal Carolina (1), South Florida (1), Vanderbilt (1), and Virgina Tech (1). These numbers add up to 42 and Ramsey will be 43 on September 8th.

Is it possible for the state of South Carolina to hit the all-time magic number of "50" on or before the final National Signing Day in February? Possibly. The *HSSR* believes that our number two rated 2026 prospect, RB/OLB **Tony O'Banner** (6-1,210) will sign with **Liberty** before the process ends. The HSSR maintains our belief that **North Augusta** OL **Malcolm Gaston** (6-5,330) will choose **Georgia** over **Virginia Tech** in the near future. These two athletes will push the major college commitments/signees to 45.

Andrews High head coach Scott Durham has told the *HSSR* that his 2026 DE/TE Chris Stewart (6-4,215) is a private major college commitment to Western Michigan, but his name has not appeared on their foot-

ball web site yet.

Stewart had 93 tackles with an incredible 31.5 TFL including 13.5 sacks, four PBU and two forced fumbles. His stats alone should draw more recruiting evaluations. Is Western Michigan trying to hide the next **JJ Watt**?

It would be a huge feather in the cap of the status of prep football in South Carolina if "we" could have 50 players sign on to major college football from the 2026 class in South Carolina.

Back in January, the *HSSR* was the first news source in South Carolina to make it known to the nation (google picked up on this story and put it at the top of their rankings for stories from SC) that six rising freshmen from South Carolina were chosen to play in the Under Armour Next Level all-American game played in Orlando, Florida in late December.

The *HSSR* has researched where five of the six now play high school football, and we wanted to share this information with you.
