

Who you believe you are determines how you live.

Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory.

Remember Who You Are...

You are a child of the King, united with Jesus.

*Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry. Because of these, the wrath of God is coming. You used to walk in these ways, in the life you once lived. But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips. Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator. **COLOSSIANS 3:5-10 NIV***

Walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.

GALATIANS 5:16 NIV

You are victorious through the Holy Spirit.

Here there is no Gentile or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all, and is in all. Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity. Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful.

COLOSSIANS 3:11-15 NIV

You are part of the Body of Christ.

Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts. And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.

For group discussion the week of March 1

This Study Guide is designed to help you apply Sunday's message. Join a Life Group and do this study together!

1. When you think back on your life, can you remember a moment when someone reminded you who you really were — or called something out in you that you didn't see in yourself? What was that like?
2. This week's message was *Made One, Made New*. Let's read Colossians 3:1-11 together. Was there a part of the message — or a phrase from this passage — that really stood out to you or felt like God was nudging your heart?
3. Let's read Romans 6:3-5. Paul says we were united with Jesus in His death and resurrection, and we've been raised to live a new life. What do you notice in this passage? What does it mean to be "united with Christ"?
4. Now let's read Romans 12:4-5. It says that in Christ we form one body, and that we belong to one another. What does this show us about God's heart for His people? What does this tell us about how God views independence versus shared life together?
5. The message challenged us to ask: Is Jesus my identity, or just part of my life? When you hear that question, what stirs in you? Do you think your relationship with Jesus tends to be more led by yourself or by the Spirit? How does Colossians 3:12-14 reveal this?
6. If identity drives behavior, what would it look like to live more intentionally as someone who is united with Christ and connected to His body? Is there one specific step you sense God inviting you to take?
7. We talked about belonging to one another — that when one part suffers, we all suffer, and when one rejoices, we all rejoice. Is there a burden that we can help pray for, or something we can celebrate with you?
