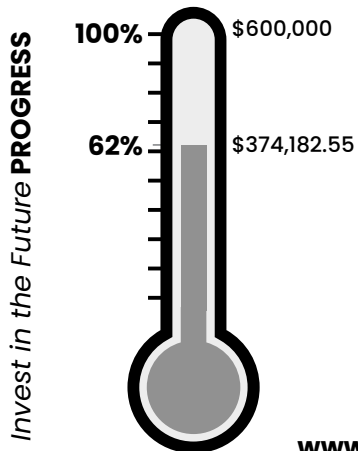

**The Waiting Is the Hardest Part**

## ACTS 1:1-14

**Author:** Luke, a gentile physician who was Paul's travel companion.

**Intended Recipient:** Theophilus, possibly a Roman official and Luke's sponsor.

Acts is a continuation of Luke's Gospel.

*"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."* **ACTS 1:8 NIV**

The primary purpose of the anointing of the Holy Spirit is so that the people of God might be witnesses to what we've seen and heard.

# TCC LIFE groups

For group discussion the week of April 12

**This Study Guide is designed to help you apply Sunday's message. Join a Life Group and do this study together!**

1. If you've ever had to wait for something important — an answer, a door to open, or a change — what was that experience like for you? What made it hard or meaningful?
2. This week's message was *The Waiting Is the Hardest Part*. Let's read Acts 1:3-11. As you reflect on the message, was there an idea or phrase that stood out to you or that you felt God highlighting for you?
3. Let's read Acts 1:12-14. What do you notice about how the disciples responded while they waited? What stands out to you about their posture or actions?
4. Read Isaiah 40:31 and Romans 15:13. What do these verses show us about God's heart or purpose in seasons of waiting? How does this reshape the way we might think about waiting?
5. Jesus made the disciples wait for ten days to prepare their hearts for His power. Looking back, can you see a "waiting season" in your life where God was actually building your character? How did that "not yet" help you later?
6. The disciples didn't just wait — they prayed together while they waited. What is one simple way you can lean into God this week during your waiting? (Maybe it's setting aside time to pray, choosing to trust instead of worry, or asking God to shape your heart in a certain way.)
7. As we close, how can we pray for you this week? Is there anything specific you're carrying in this season of waiting that we can bring before God together?

The only command Jesus gives in Acts 1: wait.

Waiting is not in the way of power; it is often the way to power.

Prayer is the place where God reshapes our hearts to want what He wants.

God, what are You doing in me here, as I wait?
