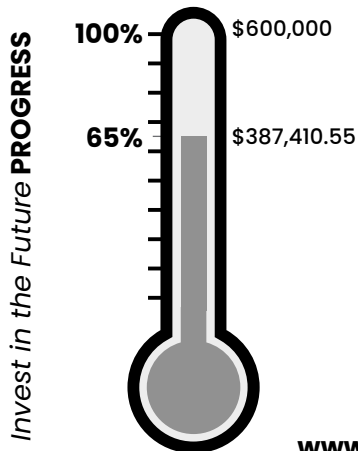

Don't Settle for Trinkets

## ACTS 3:1-11

For group discussion the week of May 17

**This Study Guide is designed to help you apply Sunday's message. Join a Life Group and do this study together!**

1. What's something you once thought would finally satisfy or "fix" things for you... but later realized it didn't go nearly as deep as you hoped?
2. This week's message was *Don't Settle for Trinkets*. Let's read Acts 3:1-10. Was there a part of the message or passage that especially stood out to you or felt like God was drawing your attention to it?
3. Now let's read Mark 2:1-12. In this story, Jesus forgives the man's sins before He heals his body. What do you notice about what Jesus cared most deeply about? What does this teach us about our greatest need?
4. Because of Jesus, we now have direct access to God's presence. Let's read Hebrews 10:19-22. What does this show us about God's heart toward people who feel unworthy, distant, broken, or "outside" like the man at the temple gate?
5. The man in Acts 3 stayed close to the temple for years, but never actually entered in until he encountered Jesus' healing power. Have you ever found yourself wanting something from God more than simply wanting closeness with God? What tends to pull your heart that direction when life gets hard?
6. This week, what would it look like for you to pursue the "greater gift" of God's presence instead of only asking Him to change your circumstances? What's one specific step you might take this week?
7. What's an area of your life right now where you deeply need God's help or nearness? How can we pray for you this week?

If God heals your soul while your circumstances remain hard, is He still worth following?
