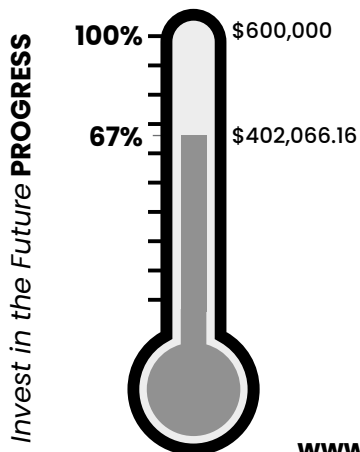

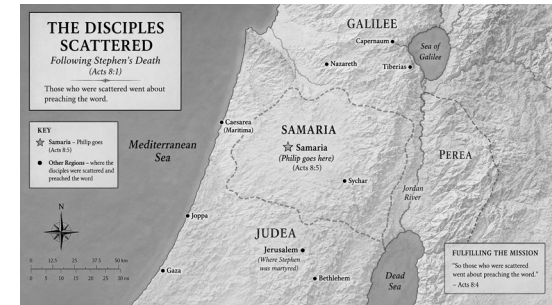

For group discussion the week of June 28

This Study Guide is designed to help you apply Sunday's message. Join a Life Group and do this study together!

1. Think about a time when you really wanted something badly, but later realized it wasn't actually what you needed. What happened?
2. This week's message was *More Than Power*. Let's read Acts 8:9-24. Was there a part of the message or passage that especially stood out to you or caught your attention?
3. Let's take a look at Acts 8:18-19 and John 6:26-27. Simon wanted what Jesus could do more than Jesus Himself. What do you think can guard our hearts from drifting in this direction?
4. Read Jeremiah 29:13 and Psalm 51:16-17. What do these verses show us about what God desires most from His people? What do they reveal about God's heart?
5. The message asked, "Do I want God, or do I want what God can do for me?" That's an honest and challenging question. In what areas of life are you tempted to treat God more like a helper for your plans rather than surrendering fully to Him?
6. This week, set aside 5-10 minutes to simply be with God in prayer. Instead of asking Him for anything right away, begin by thanking Him, worshiping Him, and asking, "Holy Spirit, search my heart and show me where I need to surrender." As you consider this, what might make that difficult for you?
7. As we close, how can we pray for you this week? Is there an area where you especially need God's help to trust, surrender, or seek Him more deeply?
