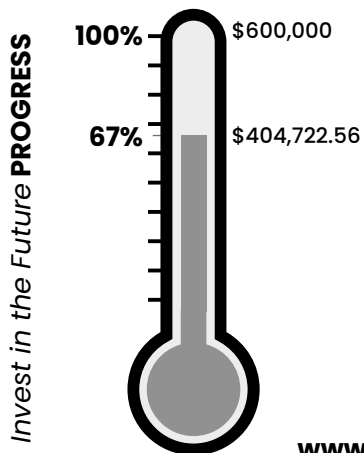

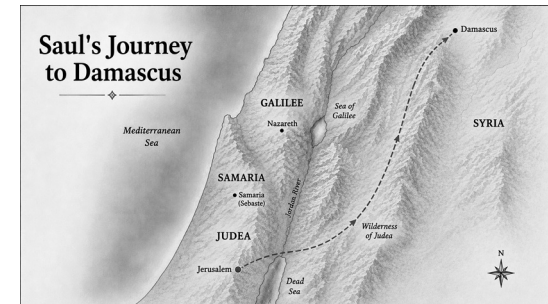

ACTS 9:1-31

For group discussion the week of July 12

This Study Guide is designed to help you apply Sunday's message. Join a Life Group and do this study together!

1. Think about a time when someone's simple act of kindness or obedience made a bigger impact on you than they probably realized. What happened?
2. This week's message was *Ordinary Miracles*. Let's read Acts 9:1-8. Was there a part of the message that stood out to you or that God called your attention to?
3. Let's read Acts 9:10-17. Ananias was asked by God to move toward someone he feared and considered an enemy. What do you notice about Ananias' response and the way God saw Saul's life?
4. God often works through ordinary faithfulness — simple conversations, prayers, meals, and examples of following Jesus. Let's take a look at Deuteronomy 6:4-7. What does this passage show us about the ways God chooses to work through His people?
5. The message asked, "Who is your Saul?" Who is someone you may have quietly decided is too far from God, too difficult to love, or beyond redemption? What would it look like to become an Ananias in that person's life?
6. This week, what is one ordinary act of obedience God may be inviting you to take? Is there a conversation to have, forgiveness to offer, encouragement to give, or someone to move toward in love?
7. As we close, how can we pray for you personally this week? Is there a burden you are carrying, or someone you want us to pray for as you seek to follow God's leading?
