

For group discussion the week of August 24

This Study Guide is designed to help you apply Sunday's message. Join a Life Group and do this study together!

1. Jesus contrasted worldly power with Christlike power that serves. Share a time when you saw someone in your life (a parent, teacher, coach, boss, friend) use their influence to serve others instead of serving themselves. How did it impact you?
2. This week's message was *Not So With You*. Let's read the key Scripture passage together: Mark 10:42–45. What caught your attention in the message? What impacted you personally?
3. Jesus modeled a different kind of leadership through serving. Let's read Philippians 2:3–5. How does this Scripture deepen your understanding of what Jesus meant when He said, "Not so with you"?
4. Worldly power often seeks to control, but God calls us to love. Let's read Romans 12:17–21. What do you notice about how Paul instructs us to respond to evil or opposition? How does this connect to the contrast between "power over" and "power with"?
5. Jesus calls us to serve instead of seeking status. Let's read John 13:12–15, where Jesus washes His disciples' feet. In what area of your life (home, work, friendships, church, online) do you find it hardest to take the role of a servant? Why is it difficult, and what does it stir in your heart as you reflect on Jesus' example?
6. Christlike leadership means giving ourselves away, not seeking to be served. This week, what is one specific way you can choose to serve someone in your family, workplace, or community without recognition? How can we encourage each other to follow through on this?
