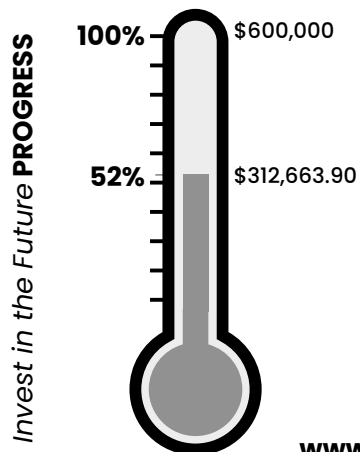
Authority: Exousia, the legitimate right or permission to exercise power.

For group discussion the week of October 26

This Study Guide is designed to help you apply Sunday's message. Join a Life Group and do this study together!

1. This week's message was about how Jesus gives His followers authority — not to control or dominate, but to love, serve, and bring healing in His name. Let's read a key Scripture: Luke 9:1-2. What stood out to you in this message? What inspired or challenged you?
2. In Luke 10 we see Jesus send out 72 of His disciples, giving them His authority to heal, cast out demons, and proclaim God's Kingdom. Let's read Luke 10:17-20 which describes their reaction as they returned and how Jesus responded. What can we learn from this?
3. Spiritual battles aren't fought with human strength but with the authority Jesus gives us. Let's read Ephesians 6:10-12. What does it look like to "stand strong in the Lord" instead of relying on your own strength?
4. Trusting God's authority often means surrendering control — believing He knows what's best even when we can't see the outcome. Let's read Proverbs 3:5-6. Where might God be inviting you to stop managing things in your own strength and trust His authority? What's one step of faith you can take to show you're relying on Him more fully?
5. The Apostle Paul describes a time when the Lord allowed Satan to torment him with an affliction. Let's read 2 Corinthians 12:7-10. How did Paul find victory in Jesus despite his weakness? What does it mean that God's power is "made perfect in weakness"?
6. Jesus gives His followers authority to bless others and point them to the Kingdom of God. What is a specific way you could exercise that authority this week — maybe by praying boldly for someone, speaking truth over fear, or standing firm in an area of temptation?
