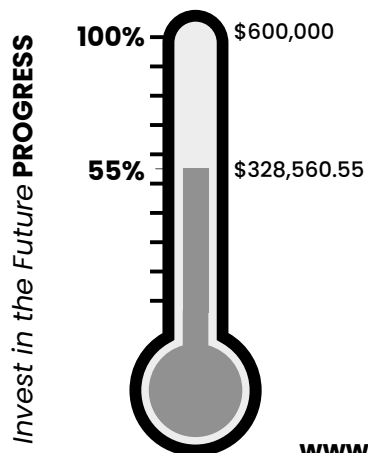

Why Follow Jesus?

LUKE 22:24-26

For group discussion the week of November 23

This Study Guide is designed to help you apply Sunday's message. Join a Life Group and do this study together!

- **If the only thing that I get from saying yes to Jesus is Jesus Himself, is that enough?**

Holy Spirit, help me see the underlying expectations I've been carrying into my relationship with Jesus, and please help me lay them down so I can truly follow Him.

1. Can you think of an incident in your life when you committed to something you expected would be easy only to find it required much more than you realized? What did you learn from that experience?
2. This week's message was *Why Follow Jesus?* Let's read John 6:57-69 together. Was there a part of the message that stood out to you or that you felt God drew your attention to?
3. Let's read Luke 22:24-26. It seems that Jesus' disciples were focused more on what they could get from Jesus than what they could give to others. What do you notice about Jesus' definition of greatness and what it means to follow Him? Also see Galatians 6:2 and Philippians 2:3-4.
4. Think about the message's theme of laying down our expectations of Jesus and choosing Him even when the feelings fade. Where do you feel the tension right now between the Jesus you hoped for and the Jesus who is inviting you to trust Him in real life?
5. In 2 Corinthians 4:17-18, Romans 8:18, and Philippians 3:7-8, Paul describes the cost of following Jesus and why he feels it's worth it. What do you see as the cost and benefit of following Jesus?
6. This week, what is one small step you can take toward following Jesus in a way that is not based on convenience, emotion, or comfort. What specific step can you take in the next few days?
