

BGCWC Embraces Staff Leadership Changes

The new year brought new leadership to BGCWC! **Chief Executive Officer Alicia Painter** (pictured top) took the helm as BGCWC's fourth leader and first female leader in our organization's 65-year history. Alicia is a graduate of Earlham College where she was a Bonner Scholar. She has been with BGCWC for 11 years, serving in several roles including Camp Director, Program Director, Unit Director, Sr. Unit Director, and Director of Operations. Alicia stated that she believes in the mission of the Boys & Girls Club and is eager to serve in this new role.

The Executive Committee also named **Jennifer Feaster** (pictured middle) as **Chief Financial Officer**. Jennifer has been with the Club for 19 years as Director of Financial Administration. She earned her bachelor's degree from Indiana University and has completed two certificate programs through the IU Lilly School of Philanthropy in Non-Profit Executive Leadership and Fundraising Management. She is an active Kiwanis member and is the immediate Past-President of the Richmond Kiwanis Club and serves on the Board of Directors for Safety Village of Wayne County, Richmond Aviation Board of Commissioners, and was recently elected to serve on the Indiana University Alumni Association Executive Council.

Later in January, BGCWC named **Rachel Winters** (pictured bottom) as our **Chief Operating Officer**. Rachel earned her Bachelor of Science in Social Work at Miami University in 2017 and has served at our Richard E. Jeffers Unit as Unit Coordinator and Unit Director since 2018. The role Chief Operating Officer is a new position, replacing the previous Director of Operations, responsible for the Clubs' day-to-day operations, providing strong leadership to staff and volunteers, and implementing new strategic initiatives related to areas such as operations, program services, program expansion, innovation, membership growth, and human resources.









We could not be prouder to announce our **2022 Youth of the Year Carly P.!** Carly is a sophomore at Richmond High School and has been a member of BGCWC for 4 years.

"The Club has become a second family to me," Carly noted. "The staff at the Club have always made me feel wanted, needed, and valued."

Carly hopes to be a representative for all youth and inspire others as YOY. She intends to use her platform to shine a light on bullying and the effect of drug use on families.

In addition to the award, Carly received a \$1,000 scholarship and advanced to compete for Indiana State Youth of the Year where she placed in the top five, received an additional scholarship, and was offered a free semester at **Ivy Tech**.



Celebrating the Life of Longtime Staff Brad Marshall

Our organization faced a difficult start to 2022 with the passing of **Brad Marshall**. Brad started at BGCWC in 2001 as Education Director. Brad was one of only six staff members at the time, so he wore multiple hats. He transitioned over to a program staff and started running programs like Passport to Manhood, affectionately known as the "Man Club" as he and his youth members would chant. He later ran the Positive Alternatives program where he found his true passion for helping youth in trouble. The last few years, Brad served as the Director of Buildings & Grounds where he oversaw the maintenance at all five Club Units. His soulful voice will be missed as well as his compassion for all his fellow co-workers.



Jack Reed Scholarship Assists Exceptional Local Teens



Richmond High School seniors **Amyia Farris** and **Wesley Phillips** both received the **Jack Reed Memorial Scholarship** during our Spring Spotlight. Both students will receive \$2,000 from the Jack Reed Memorial Scholarship and an additional \$1,000 from the **Ivy Tech Foundation** to continue their education post high school. Paul & Pat Lingle Support First Bank



Exchange for helping the Club deliver Club Fit to 676 youth during the 2021-2022 school year.






Anthem Teaches Tooth Care to the Club
