1999 and played for four years, and Nick was drafted by the **San Diego Padres** and played minor leagues for three years.

Ken Griffey Sr. made his Major League Baseball debut in 1973 with the **Cincinnati Reds** and later played for the New York Yankees, **Atlanta Braves**, and **Seattle Mariners**. In 1,997 games, Griffey complied a lifetime batting average of .296, with 152 home runs and 859 RBI. Griffey was named the Most Valuable Player of the 1980 All-Star Game and was inducted into the **Cincinnati Reds Hall of Fame** in 2004. He is the father of baseball star **Ken Griffey, Jr.**, and former minor league player **Craig Griffey**.

During the dinner guests enjoyed performances by Club Members and Cincinnati Reds Mascots Rosie and Mr. Red Legs, Griffey's reflections on a career in sports and a Q&A session with Griffey led by BGCWC Board Member Cherie Dolehanty and Club Members Lillian and Zayvion, as well as an auction led by BGCWC Board Member Garry Kleer. Griffey signed baseballs and baseball cards provided by BSN Sports and autographed prints provided by Primex Plastics. Griffey also met with several event attendees in a special VIP meet-and-greet session before the dinner. Guests were also able to meet with the Cincinnati Reds Stockings 1869 Players and learn about the Reds Museum.
