
Did you know?

- There are 18 Workforce Consultants (WFC) in communities across Alberta. WFCs provide employers with tools and resources to help them recruit, retain and strengthen their workforce.
- Employment in the province increased (1.7% month-over-month) in September after two consecutive months of decline.
- Full-time employment increased by 18,800 and part-time employment increased by 23,500 in September.

Provincial

- The provincial unemployment rate for September 2025 is 7.8%, slightly higher than the national rate of 7.1%.
- Alberta's participation rate increased slightly 0.5% to 69.3%.
- The largest monthly employment decreases were in transportation and warehousing (-8,100); information, culture and recreation (-7,100); and accommodation and food services (-3,400).
- Alberta's average weekly wage for September 2025 increased by 0.2% to \$1433.62 compared to last month.
- Hiring Bulletins are attached to this email. In September 2025, the number of job postings in Alberta fell by 0.1% (30 postings) from August 2025 and are down 6.2% (2,008 postings) from September 2025. The largest decrease in demand occurred in the following occupations:
 - Trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations (-74 job postings), followed by occupations in education, law and social, community and government services (-61 job postings).
