

Photography and Video Policy

Canby Swim Club Safe Sport Policy

Canby Swim Club uses appropriate photography and video to celebrate athletes, communicate with families and promote the team. This policy applies to images created or used by the club, its coaches and authorized representatives. USA Swimming and meet-host rules also apply.

Standards

- Images must celebrate the sport and must not be sexualized, degrading, embarrassing or otherwise inappropriate.
- Images must not be taken or retained when a swimsuit is torn or displaced or when an athlete is in a vulnerable state of dress.
- Photography or recording is prohibited in locker rooms, bathrooms, changing areas and similar spaces, except for a specific fully clothed championship celebration permitted under the current MAAPP.
- Cameras and recording devices may not be used behind the starting blocks during a race start or in other restricted areas identified by meet rules.
- Images and accompanying information must comply with applicable club privacy and Safe Sport requirements.
- Club-controlled images may be used on the team website, social-media accounts, team communications and promotional materials.

Family opt-out

A parent, legal guardian or adult athlete may opt out of club-controlled photography or promotional use by emailing both the Safe Sport Coordinator and the head coach. The club will make reasonable efforts to honor the request and will confirm that the request has been received.

Limits of the opt-out

Canby Swim Club cannot guarantee that an athlete will not appear incidentally in photographs or video created by spectators, meet hosts, news media, livestream operators or others outside the club's control at public events. The club will not knowingly select or republish an identifiable image of an opted-out athlete for Canby-controlled promotional use.

Reporting concerns

Concerns about inappropriate photography, recording or image use should be reported promptly to a coach, Board member or the Safe Sport Coordinator. Conduct that may violate MAAPP or another USA Swimming policy may also be reported through USA Swimming's reporting process.
