They are the places where sacred space meets our surrender and leads into authentic spiritual transformation. From the beginning of time, God's people have built altars to mark the places where God spoke, gave direction, or gave His blessing. It is the place where God's people surrendered offerings to Him in obedience. In the New Testament, Jesus became that surrendered offering, but He also became the place - in His person - for those who were hurting, lost, and who longed to encounter God." I look forward to leading you in this powerful Lenten journey over these 40 days before Easter.

MONARCH GROUP HOME



The Mission of the Month in February is Monarch/Group Homes. UMAR is now part of Monarch. Monarch is deeply rooted in compassion, dignity and service for special needs adults. The UMAR organization was started in 1983 by Rev. Dr. Bob Pitzer. He wanted parents of special needs adults to have their children in a home-like atmosphere and not live in an institution. He wanted them to have opportunities to work and to show their artistic abilities. The legacy of UMAR will still continue. Our ministry group visits a men's home in Greensboro and visits two women's homes in Winston-Salem. We visit the homes once a month. We do a craft, play bingo and enjoy fellowship.

This past year we had 2 events at our church – a pizza party in May and an indoor “cookout” in August. The ladies and men really look forward to these events. We also went to the Storybook Farm in Reidsville this past year. The ladies and men really enjoyed seeing all the animals. And they particularly loved holding the bunnies. We hope to go again this year. We would appreciate any amount that you can give to this wonderful ministry. In the memo of the check to ORMC, write Monarch/Group homes - you can also donate online. Some of the money is used to buy crafts and games for our monthly visits, food for the two events at our church, and the event at Storybook Farm. We do write a check to the UMAR Legacy Fund at the end of the year and specify that we want the money to help the group homes in Greensboro and Winston-Salem.

This ministry is so very special to me and to those serving in this ministry. We love the special needs adults. They show such unconditional love and the love of Jesus shines from them. A Culture of Generosity: Thank You for Your Support

2025 Ministry Celebrations

- Welcomed 57 new members including 16 through confirmation into our church community.
- Baptized 19 individuals, celebrating new life and renewed faith.
- Commissioned 4 new Stephen Ministers bringing our total to 12, helping members through difficult life situations.
- Strengthened our youth and children's ministries, with record participation in camps, service projects, and Sunday programs.
- Renovated key facilities with upgraded equipment, creating more welcoming spaces for worship and ministry.
- Supported mission work globally through Empower Guatemala sending 50 people and over \$186,000 for stoves and water filters extending Christ's love far beyond our walls. Additionally, we supported missionary efforts in the Congo with over \$22,000 of support for children to go to school
- Expanded our outreach with over \$15,000 given locally to our monthly mission partners. Our Guilford Backpack Ministry was able to provide food assistance to over 300 children monthly and a special Christmas store opportunity.

Season's greetings and Merry Christmas! We hope you had a wonderful Advent season as we celebrated the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. "Isn't it amazing that the very God who created the entire universe chose to be born as baby, to live and experience life among us, to give His life for our sins, and to be raised to life so that we might enjoy fellowship with Him forevermore". We hope and pray that we took time to reflect upon the mystery and miracle of the birth of Jesus. As we come to the end of another year, please join us in thanking the Lord for all that He has done in the past year. We also thank the Lord for your prayers and support.

Here are some praise and prayer points:

SCHOOL NEWS: We thank the Lord for your financial support. After providing school supplies, pairs of shoes to protect 100 children from injury, and soil-borne diseases; and paying monthly fees for 30 vulnerable children, we covered additional expenses including Division of Primary and Secondary education fees. By paying these fees we are securing enrollment and ensuring access to learning without interruption.



National exams: Louis and Daniel, Form-Two students, passed the National exams this year. Their academic achievement opened doors to new secondary admissions of four more six grade students. That is a big, exciting step with new subjects, teachers and meeting new friends. With the Lord's grace and your generous support, we are always able to keep children, particularly girls in school; lead to fewer street kids and fostering better community development.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING: Teaches girls and boys market-oriented and employable skills: sewing, welding, construction and mechanics. With new practical skills, these learners are making windows and doors for people that help them get money to meet their needs. Trainees in construction skills, helped to build a building around the solar panels well at Amani Home. The purpose, to protect the materials, pumps, pipes from damage and provide a stable, safe structure of accessing the water and ensuring materials longevity.

SEWING PROGRAM: "Martha who gained her Certification, currently is volunteering at the center. She trains other girls; and started her tailoring skills; uniform-making business, supporting her brothers and earning a steady income". Practical skills empower individuals, particularly vulnerable young people to achieve financial independence and build self-esteem. Many young people are unemployed, partly because their qualifications do not often match the labor market - why this program is important and part of the solution.

AMANI HOME: life in children's home keeps offering a structured, supportive and a sense of belonging as children can't live with their families. We are filled with gratitude and pride as we keep taking care of these young boys. It is meaningful growth of the service we offer through the Ministry, and the impact we make across our community. Children are building strong relationships and socializing. They are assisting themselves academically so that no one will fail. Each child gets support from his roommates on the things which he didn't understand for better performance and progress.

In November, we were honored to receive two visitors from Lubumbashi civic center. They brought food and interacted with children. These reflect our achievement and recognition for the work we do and highlight the growing need for an accessible girls' home.

Christmas celebration: during Christmas, Amani children celebrated this special event at Najoth Protestant Center. They were happy as we took them out. They celebrated with other children, fun activities, games and stories of Jesus's birth. These activities were conducted by the guest teacher from Child Evangelism fellowship in Lubumbashi. Besides that, a meal consisting of rice, chips, soup, meat, cookies, drinks, sausages, meat, and cassava leaves pounding with a mortar was provided to each child. It was so exciting as children could spend all day with joy.



BEV MEDICAL CENTER: as part of Bev's dream and initiative, this center is currently providing primary care and preventive services through the local Health Zone. Some volunteers such as licensed professionals (doctors, nurses), students community peer educators helped this year with patient care, health education and vaccines to save lives in bringing an end to the pandemic.

Materials: microscope, blood pressure monitor, baby scale, few drugs, de-wormers and mosquito nets were donated by the local health Zone. These materials help to address health issues and prevent children from malaria. Although there is still a lot to do, the impression is so positive and needs supportive efforts as many families are benefiting from this structure.

FARMING: Amani Children's Home has two areas of farmland which provide for the children and community: a garden immediately outside the walls of home and one separate farm in Fipango Village. The garden includes a variety of crops, onions, maize, amaranth and some bananas. Fipango Farm: 5 hectares have been donated by the local chief to implement children's subsistence farming to resolve malnutrition. So, we started growing cassava and beans this year. Cassava leaves will be used as vegetables and nutritious food. In the future, some will be sold for local incomes.

Land issue: as more still needs to be done, some guardians and family members are using some plots of land for growing crops that help them gain income and also help us to protect it.

Chicken unity: we managed to start with 20 layers to produce eggs for Amani children so that they can get something to eat. As this activity keeps moving forward, we will be able to start selling some in the future to generate income. We are happy as the lady who is taking care of the home, keeps supervising and cooking for children when they are busy. Children can eat eggs and enjoy their breakfast.

In closing, we would like to thank you for your prayers and financial support. We are so blessed by your faithful support! Together, the dream can be alive. Thanks once again.






Confirmation
