

Māori Heritage

The meanings of 'Karangahape': In Māori mythology, it is said that only people in the best physical condition were selected to travel from Hawaiki to Aotearoa after its discovery c.1350 AD. Hape, whose name means 'club foot' (although it can also mean 'rejected' or 'left behind') wanted to make the journey. But due to his clubbed foot, Hape was not left behind.

Many weeks later, as the voyagers arrived on the shores of the Waitematā Harbour a voice called out to them in welcome from a distant hill. It was Hape who had summoned and ridden a giant stingray across the seas and arrived earlier. The ridge became known as the place of *Te karanga a Hape* - the calling of hape.

Karangahape Road is part of the route, known as **Te Ara o Karangahape - The Path of Karangahape** that tracked what later became Symonds Street, Karangahape Road, Great North Road to Point Chevalier, south to Avondale and then on to Cornwallis at the Manukau Heads.

Karangahape Road was also known as **the "Shell Path"** due to Māori placing shells to catch the moonlight, making the route easy to follow at night.
