Symbols of the Church

Mystical Body of Christ

We are all baptized into the Mystical Body of Christ, which is the Church. Jesus is the head; we are the members.

Symbolically, just as a body has different members with different abilities, we have different gifts and roles to play as part of the Body.

Sheepfold

Jesus is the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. Jesus appointed Peter shepherd (Pope) over his flock and told him to "Feed my sheep."

Vineyard

Jesus is the vine, we are the branches. If we stay connected to Jesus, we will bear much fruit. If we do bear fruit, the Father will prune us so we bear even more.

Bark (ship)

The Church is like a ship steered by the Pope, protecting us from the storms of sin and disbelief. If we "fall overboard" the Church throws us a lifeline: the Sacrament of Penance.
