From the Pastor


Friends in Christ,




Stewardship News

As you reflect on this verse from Jeremiah, where have you seen the Lord's plans unfolding in your life?

I felt a connection to God and loved him from a young age, but I didn't meet Jesus until Tony Campolo came to Central Junior High School in White Bear Lake in the mid1980's. Yep. I am that old. We had an all school assembly where he gave a motivational talk, but then he invited students to come back for an evening talk. It was pretty easy to get permission to go back to school for that. At the end, he shared the gospel and I prayed to receive Christ. At that point, things shifted for me spiritually in ways that I did not plan. I began going to a Lutheran church youth group and then began to sing in a youth choir. The joy of singing to and for Jesus is like none other.



the Hills Lutheran Church in Shoreview


