



CHILD DEVELOPMENT

HNS gave unconditional love and support to 74 children, ages 18 months to 13 years of age in both our Kid's Place Child Development Center and our Peace Pals Programs in 2023. More than 20 students graduated kindergarten ready!

In its first year, the Bienestar Juntos Program has played a significant role in bringing mental health education to the forefront of Kid's Place Child Development Center and our community.


FOOD SECURITY

A Growing Community of Seniors

For the last two years, HNS has been delivering hot meals to seniors at the Buena Vista Community Apartment Complex on the Westside of San Antonio. Many of our seniors choose to buy medication in place of groceries and struggle with daily basic needs. One of our longtime recipients, Ms. Benton, shared that many additional residents residing here needed meal support in addition to other resources such as assistance for rent, utilities, and medication.

Our Community Health Worker team got right to work visiting senior residents to provide case management services. Enrollment within this senior community doubled within one week, and HNS has been able to extend the services to those in need. We are very happy that Ms. Benton advocated for her fellow residents!

We are excited to share we will be purchasing an HNS meal delivery vehicle to use. This will be the first in HNS history!




