LETTER OF INVITATION FOR YOUR CHILD TO PARTICIPATE IN A RESEARCH PROJECT ON IDENTIFYING RISK FACTORS FOR ASTHMA-RELATED HOSPITALISATION

Project Title: Reducing asthma-related hospitalisations and mortality in South Australia

The Respiratory Medicine and Clinical Practice Unit Research Team at The Queen Elizabeth Hospital are looking into the reasons why South Australia has more asthma-related hospitalisations than other states, particularly New South Wales and Queensland. As such, we are conducting a research project, under Ms Zoe Kopsaftis and Dr Antony Veale, to investigate potential reasons for this, and would like to extend an invitation to you, for your child to participate in this study. Your assistance with this project will help improve your child's asthma management and motivate real change in asthma care across Australia.

Attached to this invitation are a Participant Information Sheet and Consent Form that will provide further information on this research project. If you decide to consent for your child to participate, we will access the medical records of your child to collect information relating to their asthma. The researchers will not access any of your contact details or medical information unless consent is given. Following consent and collection of data from medical records, a telephone interview will be arranged with you at a time of your convenience. The interview may last up to 1 hour. During this interview, you will be asked about how your child currently manages their asthma, what is done if there are flare-ups in symptoms. We will collect some personal data from you such as your child's age, household income, asthma history and medications, but we will not be conducting any measurements or tests (e.g. no blood tests).

All information will be kept private and confidential. You will be given an identifying number and no identifiable personal information about you or your child will be used in a publication or presentation. Participation in this research is completely voluntary and you may choose to withdraw from the research at any time. This will not have any effect on your child's current or future care, or relationships with Grow Medical health professionals.
