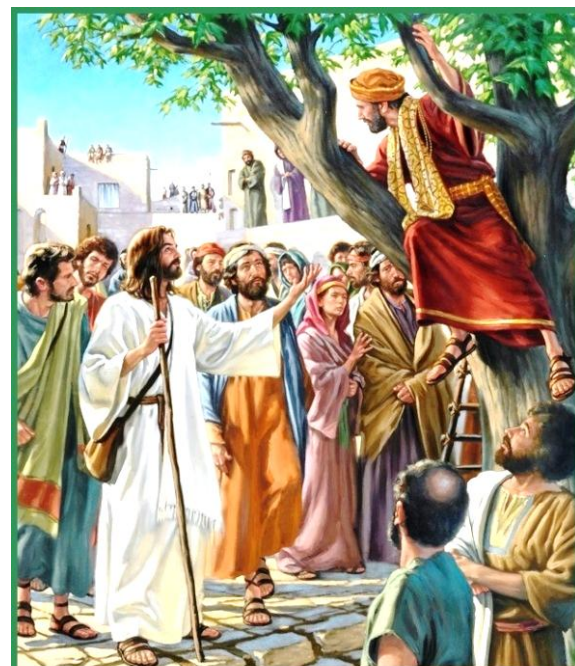

Reflection

This Sunday the season of Pentecost focuses on the living Christ and a commitment through repentance and solid faith, witnessing and proclaiming the Word of God, listening, and accepting it from all who hear it and a call to prayer and love for God and love for neighbor.

Luke alone mentions Zacchaeus the tax collector. The initiative of this wealthy chief tax collector, climbing the sycamore tree, was worthy for Jesus to look up and notice him. This simple gesture changes a man's life, inviting him down from the tree and into relationship with Him.

Luke is telling us that our physical attributes, our past history, and other people's perception are irrelevant in God's equation. When Jesus looked and saw him something surprising happened. Zacchaeus gives away half of his money and possessions, perhaps for all the times he cheated people.



For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.

How have you tried to know Jesus better? How do you feel knowing that Jesus knows your past but loves you for who you are? Whom have you been failing to notice by not taking the time to look up?

THE MYSTERIOUS EYES OF ST. CHARBEL.

The Silent Saint Whose Gaze Still Leads Souls to Jesus

Have you ever looked into someone's eyes and felt as if they could see everything hidden in your heart?

Not with judgment...

Not with anger...

But with a love so deep that it makes you want to become a better person.

This is exactly what thousands of pilgrims have said after standing before an image of St. Charbel Makhlouf, the humble Lebanese monk whose life continues to inspire Catholics around the world. Many describe a strange feeling.

They walk into a church carrying heavy burdens—worries, sins, fears, broken families, illnesses, or doubts.

Then they stop in front of St. Charbel's image.

His face is peaceful. His expression is gentle. But it is his eyes that many never forget. Some say it feels as though he is looking directly into their soul. Others quietly begin to cry.

Many find themselves praying after years away from God.

The Church does not teach that there is anything magical about his pictures or icons. Rather, many believers have found that God uses the witness of this holy monk to awaken hearts and lead them back to Jesus. And perhaps that is the greatest mystery of all.

A Man Who Wanted to Be Forgotten St. Charbel was born in Lebanon in 1828. As a young man, he could have chosen comfort, success, or wealth. Instead, he chose silence. He entered the monastery, gave up everything, and eventually became a hermit. For 23 years, he lived in solitude, dedicating his life to prayer, fasting, manual work, and above all, the Holy Eucharist. He never tried to become famous. He never sought attention. He simply wanted every beat of his heart to belong to Christ. People who knew him spoke of his humility, obedience, and deep love for God.

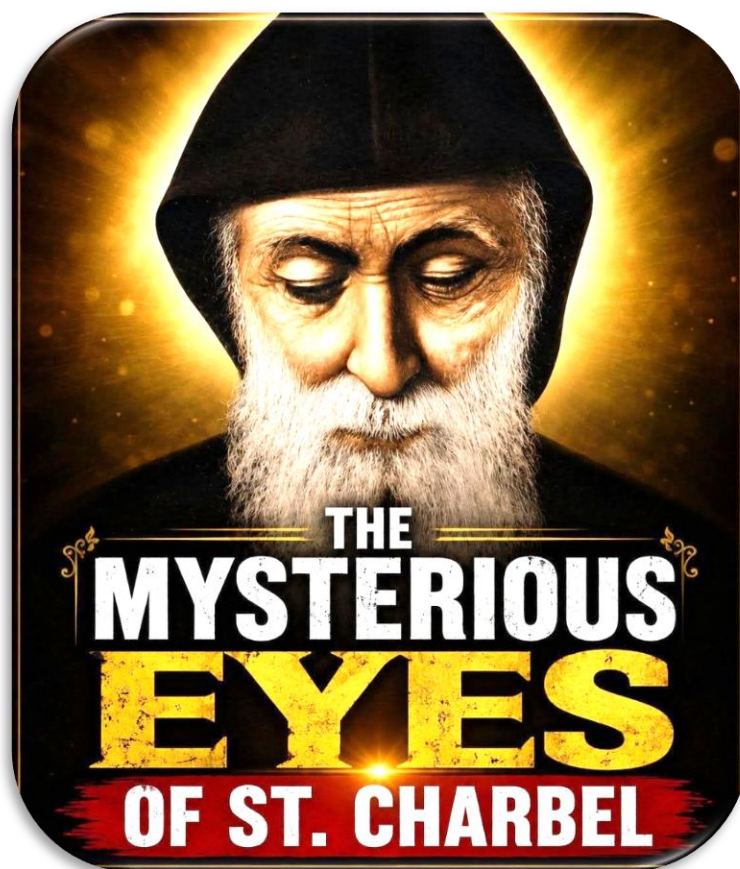
The Saint the World Discovered After His Death

When St. Charbel died in 1898, he was known mainly by the monks who had lived with him. But after his burial, extraordinary events began to attract attention .

People reported unusual lights near his tomb.

When his grave was opened, accounts from the monastery described his body as being unusually well preserved, and a mysterious reddish fluid was said to have flowed from it for many years. Pilgrims started arriving from every direction. Some came with crutches. Others came carrying photographs of sick family members. Many came with broken hearts.

They prayed, asking St. Charbel to intercede for them before God. Over the years, countless people have testified to receiving physical healing, spiritual peace, or a renewed faith through his intercession. Several healings were carefully investigated by the Catholic Church during the process that led to his canonization.



The Eyes That Point to Jesus

One pilgrim once shared that he had entered the monastery only out of curiosity. He had no intention of praying. But as he stood before an image of St. Charbel, he could not stop looking at the saint's eyes. He later said it felt as though those eyes were silently asking him one question:

"How long will you keep running from God's mercy?"

He left the church, but the question stayed with him.

The next day, he returned. He went to Confession for the first time in many years. His life changed—not because of a picture, but because God used the witness of a holy saint to touch his conscience. That is the true power of the saints. They never draw attention to themselves. They always point us to Jesus.

The Greatest Miracle

Many people know St. Charbel because of the miracles associated with his intercession. But his greatest miracle was something even more beautiful. He became a man so filled with God's grace that, even after his death, his life continues to inspire others to seek Christ. His eyes remind us of a simple truth:

Look at Jesus more than you look at the world.

Pray more than you complain.

Love God more than you love comfort.

The eyes of St. Charbel are mysterious only because they reflect a heart that belonged completely to Christ.

And perhaps that is why so many people still feel drawn to them today.

They are not calling us to admire a saint. They are inviting us to follow the Savior whom St. Charbel loved with his whole life.

St. Charbel Makhlouf, faithful monk, miracle worker, and humble servant of Christ, pray for us, that our eyes may always be fixed on Jesus. **Amen.**

OUR MARONITE PATRIARCH CARDINAL BECHARA BOUTROS EL RAI: Lebanon is not built on divisions... and we must restore citizens' trust

Maronite Patriarch Cardinal Mar Bechara Boutros Al-Rahi presided over the Thanksgiving Mass for the beatification of Blessed Patriarch Mar Elias Peter Al-Hawayek, affirming that Lebanon is not built on divisions but on the unity of its children and the establishment of a state of right and law.

The Maronite Patriarch Cardinal Mar Bechara Boutros Al-Rahi presided over the Thanksgiving Mass for the beatification of the Blessed Patriarch Mar Elias Peter Al-Hawayek at the Patriarchal Seat in Dimane, affirming that "Lebanon is not built on divisions, but on the unity of its children, and on the establishment of a state of right and law, following the example of Al-Hawayek, who combined holiness with nation-building, and made freedom and coexistence an eternal message for Lebanon."

Assisting Al-Rahi in the Mass were: Metropolitans Elias Nassar, Simon Fadoul, and Samir Mazloum, Father Fadi Tabet, and Priests Camillo Mikhail, Elie Saadeh, Nemtallah Makrazel, Karim George, and George Yarak, in the presence of a crowd of believers who came from various regions.

After the reading of the Holy Gospel, Al-Rahi delivered a homily titled: "He who is not with me is against me, and he who does not gather with me scatters," in which he considered that "this Gospel word summarizes the message of Patriarch Al-Hawayek, who was not a man of division, but a man of encounter and unity, who gathered Lebanese around the human being and the nation, and made truth and justice the foundation of every national project."



Al-Rahi affirmed that "the beatification of Al-Hawayek is not limited to honoring a historical figure, but is a declaration that holiness is capable of making history, and that when faith meets national responsibility, it becomes a force that builds nations and preserves human dignity," welcoming "the envoy of His Holiness the Pope, Cardinal Marcello Semeraro, who presided over the beatification ceremony," considering that "his presence embodies the depth of communion between the Maronite Church and the Apostolic See, and confirms the status Lebanon holds in the heart of the Universal Church."

He also reviewed the key milestones in the life of Blessed Al-Hawayek, from his academic and priestly formation, through his service in Bkerki, to his election as Patriarch, noting that he "lived relying on divine providence, and thus deserved to be known as the 'Patriarch of the Poor' after he opened the doors of the church during the famine of 1916 to save the starving, and made service to humanity the priority of his mission."

POPE LEO XIV HAILS NEW MARONITE BLESSED

At the Angelus, Pope Leo XIV praises the beatification of Patriarch Elias Hoayek, praying that the new Blessed's intercession will bring peace to Lebanon and strengthen Maronite faithful worldwide.

Pope Leo XIV on Sunday paid tribute to the newly beatified Blessed Elias Hoayek, praying that his witness and intercession may bring peace to Lebanon and strengthen Maronite faithful throughout the world.

Speaking after the Angelus in Castel Gandolfo, the Pope recalled that Blessed Elias Hoayek, Patriarch of Antioch of the Maronites from 1899 to 1931 and Founder of the Congregation of the Maronite Sisters of the Holy Family, was beatified in Lebanon the previous day.

The Pope noted that Blessed Elias led the Maronite Church for more than thirty years "with great dedication and pastoral sensitivity."

Describing him as "a man of dialogue and hope," Pope Leo said he was "a shining point of reference in ecclesial, social and political life," so much so that he came to be known as the "Father of Greater Lebanon."

Concluding his reflection, the Pope prayed that "the prayers and intercession of the new Blessed" may always accompany Maronite faithful throughout the world and obtain "the gift of peace for the entire people of Lebanon," a country that, he said, "is so dear to me."

Beatification Mass

The beatification Mass was celebrated on Saturday in Dimane, the summer seat of the Maronite Patriarchate, with Cardinal Marcello Semeraro presiding as the personal envoy of Pope Leo XIV.

In his homily, Maronite Patriarch Cardinal Bechara Boutros Rai presented Hoayek as a pastor whose holiness was inseparable from his service to both the Church and the Lebanese nation.

He described the new Blessed as "a man of God," "the Patriarch of the poor and the oppressed," and a leader who placed complete trust in Divine Providence. Rai recalled Hoayek's efforts to feed the starving during the famine of 1916, his determination to defend Lebanon's identity and sovereignty at the 1919 Paris Peace Conference, and his commitment to education, charitable works and the renewal of the Maronite Church.

The Patriarch said Hoayek united "the vigilance of a shepherd, the wisdom of a leader, the heart of a father and the faith of a saint," leaving a legacy of faith, hope and national unity that continues to guide Lebanon today.

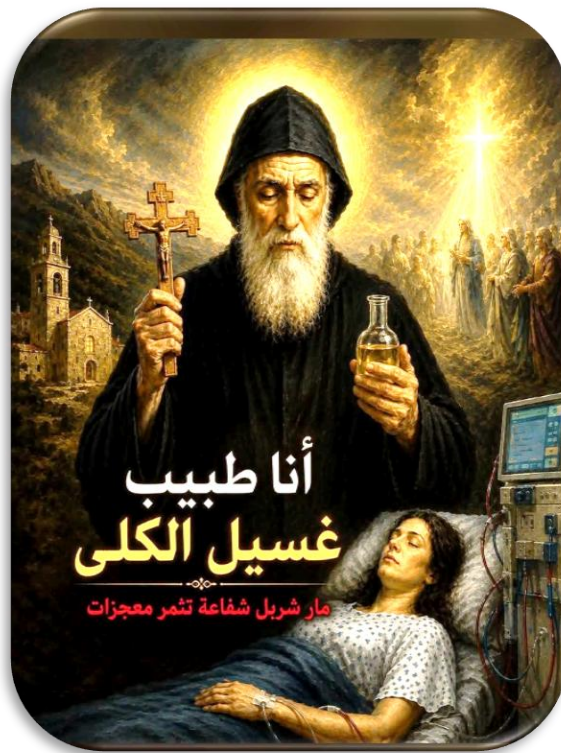
According to her mother's testimony, the doctors informed the family that her daughter had passed away and asked them to say their final goodbyes.

CARDINAL URGES TRUST OVER CONTROL AS SAINT CHARBEL RELIC VISITS MANILA CATHEDRAL



Cardinal Jose Advincula urged Catholics to choose trust over control Wednesday as the pilgrim relic of St. Charbel Makhlouf visited Manila Cathedral.

Speaking during Mass on the Solemnity of the Annunciation, Advincula linked Mary's "yes" to God with St. Charbel's life of silent, radical surrender.

"Both Mama Mary and St. Charbel show us the same path: not control, but trust; not clarity, but faithfulness; not visibility, but hidden holiness," he said.

Advincula said both figures followed a path marked not by certainty or recognition, but by humility, faithfulness and openness to God's will.

The cardinal said Mary's acceptance disrupted her ordinary life plans but opened the way for salvation through obedience.

Similarly, he added, St. Charbel embraced a hidden life of prayer, fasting and solitude, far from worldly acknowledgment.

The Lebanese Maronite monk and hermit, canonized in 1977, is widely venerated for his austere spirituality and reported miracles.

Advincula said the relic is more than a sacred object; it is a call to live a life fully given to God.

"The relic of St. Charbel is not just a reminder of a holy man. It is a living invitation for all of us to imitate a life totally given to God," he said.

He also said that the visit encourages Catholics to rediscover faith expressed through quiet fidelity rather than public recognition.

"In St. Charbel, we see how that same surrender can be lived out daily, quietly and faithfully," Advincula said.

PRAYERS URGED-PRAYERS FOR SPEEDY CAUSE OF BISHOP ALFREDO VERZOSA

Hundreds of Catholics gathered Saturday in Vigan to mark the 72nd death anniversary of Servant of God Alfredo Verzosa, as a retired archbishop urged the faithful to pray for the swift advancement of his sainthood cause.

During a Mass at the Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle Metropolitan Cathedral, Nueva Segovia Archbishop Emeritus Ernesto Salgado called on the faithful to pray that Verzosa's beatification and canonization be speedily brought to completion.

In his homily, Salgado said one of Verzosa's defining virtues was his unwavering obedience to God's will, drawing a parallel with Jesus Christ's faithful acceptance of suffering and death.

Born in Vigan in 1877, Verzosa became the first priest ordained for the Archdiocese of Nueva Segovia after the Spanish colonial rule in 1904.

He is remembered for defending the Roman Catholic Church in the Ilocos region during the schism led by fellow Vigan native Isabelo de los Reyes and Ilocano priest Gregorio Aglipay.

Historical accounts say Verzosa endured persecution while carrying out his ministry. In Ilocos Norte, he was struck in the chest by a stone while preaching. In Bantay, he narrowly escaped injury after a spear was hurled at him by a schismatic attempting to stop his barrio mission.

Appointed bishop of Lipa in 1916, Verzosa shepherded the diocese for 33 years, overseeing what were then the provinces of Batangas, Laguna, Tayabas (now Quezon), Mindoro and Marinduque.

Despite the size of the diocese, he travelled extensively by horseback and boat to visit parishes.

He pushed the establishment of schools and catechetical centers to strengthen the faith and reach those who had grown distant from the Church.

In 1923, Verzosa founded the Missionary Catechists of the Sacred Heart (MCSH), the first religious congregation for women established by a Filipino diocesan bishop. His ministry was marked by hardship, which he endured with steadfast faith and perseverance.

The Mass was attended by a delegation of the MCSH from Lipa, along with devotees from Batangas, Manila and the Ilocos region.

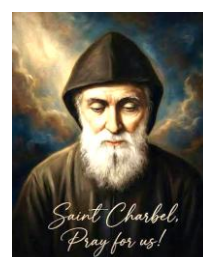
