

"In fact, all the world came to Joseph to obtain rations of grain, for famine had gripped the whole world." Genesis 41:57

Joseph saved hundreds of thousands people from starvation. He was one of the greatest person in history. Joseph's brothers were also called to greatness, but they wasted their lives through jealousy, violence, deceit, guilt, and self-hatred. Every Christian is greater than Joseph (Mt 11:11), because we are adopted sons and daughters of God Our Father. It is an understatement to say that we are destined for greatness. Jesus even promised that we who have faith in Him will do greater works than He did (Jn 14:12).

Will we do greater works than Joseph and Jesus, Or will we do worse than Joseph's brothers? OUR HOLY FATHER POPE FRANCIS SENDS FORTH MISSIONARY FAMILIES

At the conclusion of the 10th world Day of Families, Pope Francis invites families to "announce the beauty of being family with joy!"

Pope Francis has a mission for Catholic families: "Proclaim the beauty of being a family with joy! Proclaim the grace of Christian marriage to children and young people."

The Holy Father addressed his "missionary mandate" especially to participants in the tenth World Meeting of Families, which concluded Saturday night with a joyful Eucharistic liturgy celebrated by Cardinal Kevin Farrell in St Peter's Square. Pope Francis was in attendance at the Mass, and proclaimed the homily.

Following the ceremony, Pope Francis' Missionary Mandate to families was distributed to those present. Copies of the Mandate were also given out on Sunday to pilgrims and visitors who had come to St Peter's Square for the weekly Angelus.

"Give hope to those who have none"

In his Mandate, the Pope invited young families to "be guided by those who know the way," and more established families to "be companions on the journey for others." And for families who have lost their way, he encouraged them not to be overcome by sadness, but to "trust in the Love that God has placed in you, [and] request the Spirit each day to revive it."

His call included the exhortation to "give hope to those who have none," to "be the ones to 'sew' the fabric of society and of a synodal Church, creating relationships, multiplying love and life," to "be a sign of the living Christ," without fear of what the Lord is asking of them or of responding generously to His call.

Open yourselves to Christ, listen to Him in the silence of prayer. Accompany those who are most fragile, take responsibility for those who are alone, for refugees, for the abandoned.

"Be families with big hearts"

Finally, Pope Francis said, "Be the seed of a more fraternal world! Be families with big hearts! Be the welcoming face of the Church! And please pray, always pray!"

The Pope's mandate to families, sending them forth as missionary mandates, concluded this edition of the World Meeting of Families, which took place not only in Rome, but also in diocesan and parish settings around the world.

Following Saturday's concluding Mass, the Prefect of the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life, Cardinal Kevin Farrell, announced that the next gathering of families would be the "Jubilee of Families," which will take place in Rome in the context of the Jubilee Year 2025. The 11th World Meeting of Families will take place in 2028.

OUR U.S. MARONITE BISHOP: : 'I'VE NEVER SEEN LEBANON LIKE THIS BEFORE'

Two U.S. Maronite Catholic dioceses are sponsoring 450 families each month in Lebanon and have provided several hundred thousand dollars for hospitalization costs.

"I've never seen Lebanon like this before," Maronite Bishop A. Elias Zaidan of Our Lady of Lebanon of Los Angeles told Catholic News Service in mid-June. "What concerns me the most," he said of his homeland, "is the dire need of the people. It's a very, very sad situation." Zaidan is a U.S. board member for Caritas, the church's charitable aid agency in Lebanon, and the two U.S. Maronite dioceses work through Caritas Lebanon. Since late 2019, Lebanon has been in an unprecedented economic crisis, such that nearly 90% of the population is now living in poverty.

"We need to save the Lebanese people," said Zaidan.


During his visit to Lebanon, the Los Angeles bishop met with Carmelite Father Michel Abboud, president of Caritas Lebanon, who said the organization is experiencing an increase in the number of families asking for support. The priest said the coming year is expected "to be a very difficult one" and thus is asking for more help.

With the collapse of the Lebanese currency — its devaluation has reached 95% — Zaidan said that, now, even \$50 "can go a long way" in helping a struggling family, and that \$300-\$400 can nearly cover a Catholic school annual tuition.

"Now is the time to save Lebanon. We need to save the Lebanese people," Zaidan said.

After Maronite bishops from around the world met in Lebanon June 13-18, they said the "the deteriorating economic, financial, social, living and security situation in Lebanon and Syria" constituted "a dangerous reflection on Lebanon's identity, role, and mission, and on the presence of Christianity in the Middle East."

The prelates commended "the great efforts" of bishops, in cooperation with parish priests and committed laypeople in the field of social service and church and civil associations, who worked on getting the necessary help to those in need and encouraged the faithful to "remain firm in their faith in God." They also thanked Maronite dioceses in the diaspora — like the two in the United States — and international church and civil institutions for their support.

The bishops also warned that Lebanon's Catholic schools "are threatened with closure and collapse due to the great challenges in the current economic, social and living conditions, the inability of the state to pay its dues and the difficulty of parents in paying the installments."

The bishops reiterated "the educational mission of the church, which has contributed through the ages and continues to contribute to the development of societies and the spiritual, scientific and national advancement of humanity. This has made Lebanon a country of distinctive cultural radiance."

They demanded that the state "do its duty to support private education as well as public education" and to support social security, medical care and hospitalization for all citizens.

MIRACLES OF SAINT SHARBEL **HANNA JABBOUR**

Hanna who lived in the island of St. Catherine was diagnosed with leukemia. He was transported in the President's private plane to Caracas for treatment. But medical tests showed that the cancer had spread into the bloodstream.

Hanna's uncle visited him in the hospital and gave his sister, Hanna's mother, a picture of Saint Charbel put it under her son's bed. Later on, the picture began to leak blood and when the doctor arrived, he was surprised to see the blood on the photo because Hanna had no injury in the body to explain it.

When Hanna underwent tests again, it proved that he was completely healed. The President asked for the photo and it was sent to him. Hanna's father traveled to Lebanon to visit the tomb of Saint Charbel at the monastery of Saint Maron - Annaya and praised God for the healing of his son. He registered the miracle on 27/04/2012.

ST. CHARBEL MAKHLUF: THE WONDERWORKER, JULY 24

On July 24, the Church celebrates the life of St. Charbel Makhlouf, a Maronite Catholic priest, monk and hermit who is known for working miracles both during his life and after his death.

On the occasion of his beatification in 1965, the Eastern Catholic hermit was described by Pope Paul VI as "a new, eminent member of monastic sanctity" who "through his example and his intercession is enriching the entire Christian people."

Born into humble circumstances in Lebanon during 1828, Yussef Antoun Makhlouf was the youngest of Antoun Zaarour Makhlouf and Brigitta Elias al-Shediyaq's five children. Antoun, who had been taken away from the family and forced into hard labor, died when his youngest son was only 3.

Yussef studied at the parish school and tended to his family's cow. Engaged in prayer and solitude from an early age, he spent a great deal of time outdoors in the fields and pastures near his village, contemplating God amid the inspiring views of Lebanon's valleys and mountains.

His uncle and guardian Tanious wanted the boy to continue working with him, while his mother wanted him to marry a young woman. Yussef had other plans, however, and left home in 1851 without informing anyone.



Yussef would become "Brother Charbel," after making a pilgrimage on foot to his new monastic home. In this, he followed the example of his maternal uncles, who were already living as solitary monks at the Hermitage of St. Paul in the Qadisha Valley.

Charbel took his monastic vows in November of 1853, during a solemn ceremony which was closed to the public and off-limits even to his family. He subsequently studied for the priesthood and was ordained, returning to the Monastery of St. Maron.

The priest-monk lived and served in the monastery for 19 years, showing great devotion to the life of prayer, manual work and contemplative silence.

Charbel's superiors observed God's "supernatural power" at work in his life, and he became known as a wonder-worker even among some Muslims. In 1875, he was granted permission to live as a solitary monk in a nearby hermitage dedicated to Sts. Peter and Paul.

Rigorous asceticism, and a profound union with God, continued to characterize the monk's life for the next 23 years. Deeply devoted to God's Eucharistic Presence, he suffered a stroke while celebrating



the Divine Liturgy on Dec. 16, 1898. He died on Christmas Eve of that year.

St. Charbel's tomb has been a site for pilgrimages since his death. Hundreds of miracles are believed to have occurred through his intercession with God, both in Lebanon and around the world.

He was canonized in 1977 by Pope Paul VI, who had earlier hailed the Lebanese Maronite saint as an "admirable flower of sanctity blooming on the stem of the ancient monastic traditions of the East."

10 Reasons Why Handheld Devices Should Be Banned for Children Under the Age of 12

The American Academy of Pediatrics and the Canadian Society of Pediatrics state infants aged 0-2 years should not have any exposure to technology, 3-5 years be restricted to one hour per day, and 6-18 years restricted to 2 hours per day (AAP 2001/13, CPS 2010). Children and youth use 4-5 times the recommended amount of technology, with serious and often life threatening consequences (Kaiser Foundation 2010, Active Healthy Kids Canada 2012). Handheld devices (cell phones, tablets, electronic games) have dramatically increased the accessibility and usage of technology, especially by very young children (Common Sense Media, 2013). As a pediatric occupational therapist, I'm calling on parents, teachers and governments to ban the use of all handheld devices for children under the age of 12 years. Following are 10 research-based reasons for this ban. Please visit zonein.ca to view the Zone'in Fact Sheet for referenced research.

1. Rapid brain growth

Between 0 and 2 years, infant's brains triple in size, and continue in a state of rapid development to 21 years of age (Christakis 2011). Early brain development is determined by environmental stimuli, or lack thereof. Stimulation to a developing brain caused by overexposure to technologies (cell phones, internet, iPads, TV), has been shown to be associated with executive functioning and attention deficit, cognitive delays, impaired learning, increased impulsivity and decreased ability to self-regulate, e.g. tantrums (Small 2008, Pagini 2010).

2. Delayed Development

Technology use restricts movement, which can result in delayed development. One in three children now enter school developmentally delayed, negatively impacting literacy and academic achievement (HELP EDI Maps 2013). Movement enhances attention and learning ability (Ratey 2008). Use of technology under the age of 12 years is detrimental to child development and learning (Rowan 2010).

3. Epidemic Obesity

TV and video game use correlates with increased obesity (Tremblay 2005). Children who are allowed a device in their bedrooms have 30% increased incidence of obesity (Feng 2011). One in four Canadian, and one in three U.S. children are obese (Tremblay 2011). 30% of children with obesity will develop diabetes, and obese individuals are at higher risk for early stroke and heart attack, gravely shortening life expectancy (Center for Disease Control and Prevention 2010). Largely due to obesity, 21st century children may be the first generation many of whom will not outlive their parents (Professor Andrew Prentice, BBC News 2002).

4. Sleep Deprivation

60% of parents do not supervise their child's technology usage, and 75% of children are allowed technology in their bedrooms (Kaiser Foundation 2010). 75% of children aged 9 and 10 years are sleep deprived to the extent that their grades are detrimentally impacted (Boston College 2012).

5. Mental Illness

Technology overuse is implicated as a causal factor in rising rates of child depression, anxiety, attachment disorder, attention deficit, autism, bipolar disorder, psychosis and problematic child behavior (Bristol University 2010, Mentzoni 2011, Shin 2011, Liberatore 2011, Robinson 2008). One in six Canadian children have a diagnosed mental illness, many of whom are on dangerous psychotropic medication (Waddell 2007).

6. Aggression

Violent media content can cause child aggression (Anderson, 2007). Young children are increasingly exposed to rising incidence of physical and sexual violence in today's media. "Grand Theft Auto V" portrays explicit sex, murder, rape, torture and mutilation, as do many movies and TV shows. The U.S. has categorized media violence as a Public Health Risk due to causal impact on child aggression (Huesmann 2007). Media reports increased use of restraints and seclusion rooms with children who exhibit uncontrolled aggression.

7. Digital dementia

High speed media content can contribute to attention deficit, as well as decreased concentration and memory, due to the brain pruning neuronal tracks to the frontal cortex (Christakis 2004, Small 2008). Children who can't pay attention can't learn.

8. Addictions

As parents attach more and more to technology, they are detaching from their children. In the absence of parental attachment, detached children can attach to devices, which can result in addiction (Rowan 2010). One in 11 children aged 8-18 years are addicted to technology (Gentile 2009).

9. Radiation emission

In May of 2011, the World Health Organization classified cell phones (and other wireless devices) as a category 2B risk (possible carcinogen) due to radiation emission (WHO 2011). James McNamee with Health Canada in October of 2011 issued a cautionary warning stating "Children are more sensitive to a variety of agents than adults as their brains and immune systems are still developing, so you can't say the risk would be equal for a small adult as for a child." (*Globe and Mail* 2011). In December, 2013 Dr. Anthony Miller from the University of Toronto's School of Public Health recommend that based on new research, radio frequency exposure should be reclassified as a 2A (probable carcinogen), not a 2B (possible carcinogen). American Academy of Pediatrics requested review of EMF radiation emissions from technology devices, citing three reasons regarding impact on children (AAP 2013).

10. Unsustainable

The ways in which children are raised and educated with technology are no longer sustainable (Rowan 2010). Children are our future, but there is no future for children who overuse technology. A team-based approach is necessary and urgent in order to reduce the use of technology by children. The following Technology Use Guidelines for children and youth were developed by Cris Rowan, pediatric occupational therapist and author of *Virtual Child*; Dr. Andrew Doan, neuroscientist and author of *Hooked on Games*; and Dr. Hilarie Cash, Director of reSTART Internet Addiction Recovery Program and author of *Video Games and Your Kids*, with contribution from the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Canadian Pediatric Society in an effort to ensure sustainable futures for all children.

Pope Francis has appointed new members of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of Sacraments, including Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle.

The cardinal's appointment was announced by the Vatican on Wednesday, June 1.

The prefect of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples is among the 22 new members of the congregation currently headed by Cardinal-designate Arthur Roche.

He is also the second current Filipino member of the dicastery, the other being Archbishop Romulo Valles of Davao, whose appointment was renewed by the pope last March.

Members of Vatican congregations normally have five-year term and may be renewed for a second term.

The congregation is charged with overseeing most of the global Catholic Church's liturgical concerns.


