Receive the Holy Spirit

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“Pentecost” in Greek means “the Gathering”. It was celebrated in Jerusalem as the feast of the Gathering when all the Jews gathered in a Pilgrimage, to commemorate God’s gift of the Law of Moses on Mount Sinai. On the fiftieth day after Passover, the disciples, Mary, and a few other women were assembled in the Upper Room.

In the morning God appeared to them as He had to Moses on Sinai; in the midst of a violent windy storm. His Spirit settled upon them in the form of tongues of fire which rested on their heads.

God’s grace may be compared to what happened to the people of Babel, who spoke one common language and yet, because of their sins, were no longer able to understand each other. At Pentecost, although the people spoke diverse languages, they understood the single language of the disciples. This is clearly a symbol of God’s call for unity.

The Spirit gave them the gifts and the power to evangelize the world by means of the new assembly of God’s people, the Church. That is why the feast of Pentecost and the Season which follows invites us to meditate on: ‘the One, Holy, Catholic Church’, which the Spirit has sanctified and which Christ founded.

OUR HOLY FATHER POPE FRANCIS ANNOUNCES 21 NEW CARDINALS FROM AROUND THE WORLD

Pope Francis announces that he will create 21 new Cardinals at a Consistory on Saturday, 27 August. They represent the Church worldwide, and reflect a wide variety of cultures, contexts and pastoral ministries.

At the conclusion of the Regina Coeli on Sunday, Pope Francis said that on Saturday, 27 August, he will hold a Consistory for the creation of new cardinals.

He also said that he will meet during the next two days - on Monday and Tuesday, 29-30 August - with all the cardinals to reflect on the new Apostolic Constitution *Praedicate evangelium*.

“On Saturday, 27 August, I will hold a Consistory for the creation of new Cardinals. Let us pray that they will help me in my mission as Bishop of Rome for the good of all God's people.”

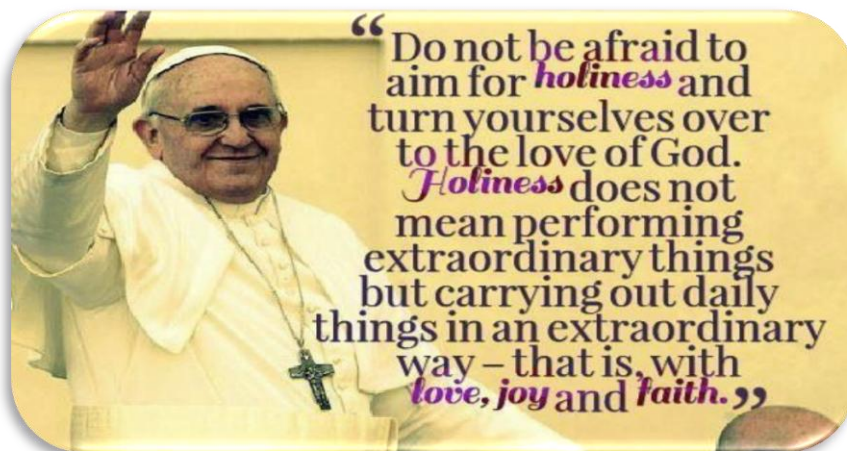
The College of Cardinals currently consists of 208 Cardinals, of whom 117 are electors and 91 non-electors. As of 27 August, the number will grow to 229 Cardinals, of whom 131 will be electors.

Wide-ranging group

Eight of the newly named Cardinals are from Europe, six from Asia, two from Africa, one from North America, and four from Central and Latin America.

OUR MARONITE PATIRARCH CARDINAL BECHARA EL RAI URGES LEBANESE TO VOTE EN MASSE AT ELECTIONS

As Lebanon gears up for parliamentary election on 15 May, Maronite Patriarch Béchara Boutros al-Rai urges Lebanese citizens to vote en masse to preserve the country's self-determination and identity as it endures its worst crisis since the war of 1975-1990.

Lebanon is slated to hold a long-awaited parliamentary election on 15 May, which many Lebanese, as well as the international community, hope will bring an overdue political change and provide concrete solutions to the country's multiple crises, including its worst economic tumble in decades.

Ahead of the polls, Maronite Patriarch Béchara Boutros al-Rai has urged Lebanese citizens to come out to vote in great numbers, stressing that elections give them the opportunity to tell the world what kind of country they aspire to.

Citizens want a free and neutral Lebanon

Speaking at Mass on Sunday in the Shrine of Our Lady of Harissa, Cardinal al Rai remarked that the majority of Lebanese people want "a free, democratic and neutral Lebanon; a Lebanon with a historical identity, founded on justice and equality with one army and constitutional institutions", and want to "live and prosper in a free economy".

For this reason, he said, all Lebanese citizens should make use of their right to vote; "to tell the world what Lebanon they want", and that they reject any geopolitical design aimed at putting the country under foreign tutelage and reducing its full sovereignty.

In recent years, the head of the Maronite Church has insistently advocated for Lebanese neutrality so as to preserve its independence and pluralistic identity.

Need for peaceful electoral campaign

In his homily Patriarch al Rai also called for a peaceful and orderly electoral campaign, expressing concern over the growing international and regional tensions.

He mentioned tensions along the southern border with Israel, which, added to some recent incidents in Lebanon, could affect its precarious social stability on the eve of this crucial ballot.

A crucial election for Lebanon

The election will be the first since hundreds of thousands of Lebanese took to the streets in October 2019, protesting against the deteriorating economic conditions, endemic corruption, and the entire political leadership that has been governing the country since the end of the war in Lebanon in 1990.

The results will be decisive also because the next Parliament will have to elect a new president to succeed Michel Aoun, whose six-year term ends in October this year.

Growing poverty

The vote comes as Lebanon is struggling with a financial downturn caused by decades of corruption and mismanagement, and with a crashing currency that has lost more than 90 percent of its value in three years. This has caused prices of food and basic commodities to skyrocket and plunged 78 percent of Lebanese population into poverty.

The economic crisis has worsened dramatically after the COVID-19 outbreak and the massive explosion in Beirut's port on 4 August 2020, which killed more than 200 people, injured thousands, left 300,000 people homeless, and caused billions in damage. Russia's invasion of Ukraine has also exacerbated the food crisis in the country.

Delegation of French bishops to visit Lebanon

In this dramatic context, a delegation of French Bishops is set to travel on 8 May to Lebanon for a five-day visit to convey the closeness and support of the Church in France to the Lebanese people and Churches.

The seven-member delegation, headed by Archbishop Éric de Moulins-Beaufort of Reims, president of the French Bishop's Conference (CEF), will meet the Lebanese patriarchs, local religious communities, and people in need.

The visit will offer an opportunity to confirm the close relations between the Church of France and the Lebanese Churches. It will also draw attention to the charity work carried out throughout the country by French Catholic organizations such as l'Œuvre d'Orient, CCFD Terre Solidaires, Fondation d'Auteuil, JRS France, alongside the Order of Malta, Caritas Lebanon and Aid to the Church in Need (ACN), amongst others, with the generous financial support of French Catholic donors.

The delegation will meet the Maronite, Melkite, Syriac, and Armenian patriarchs, as well as bishops representing the Chaldean and Latin Churches in Lebanon, along with the Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop Joseph Spiteri, and the French Ambassador in the country.

French Bishops will also visit schools and facilities supported by Catholic charities, religious communities, as well as a Palestinian Christian refugee camp.

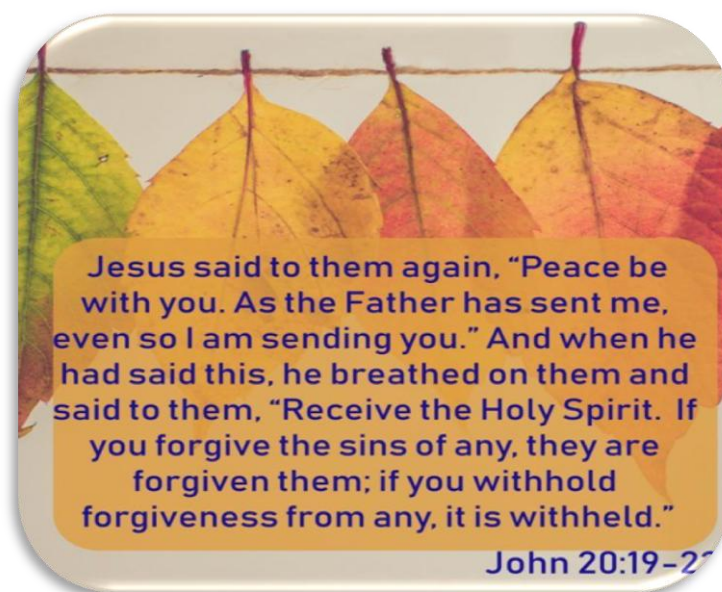
Yearning for the Spirit of Unity and Holiness

Feast of Saints Peter and Paul – June 1

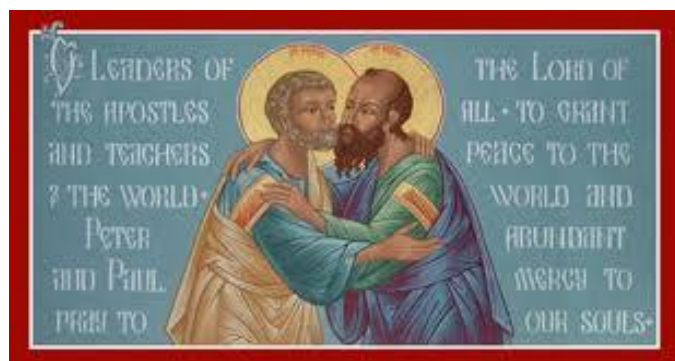
The **Feast of Saints Peter and Paul**, or the **Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul**, is a liturgical feast in honour of the martyrdom in Rome of the apostles Saint Peter and Saint Paul, which is observed on 29 June. The celebration is of ancient origin, the date selected being the anniversary either of their death or of the translation of their relics.

In the Roman Catholic Church

In the Roman Catholic calendar of saints, it is celebrated as a solemnity. In the General Roman Calendar of 1962, it is a first-class feast. It is a holy day of obligation in the universal Church.

In England and Wales the feast is observed as a holy day of obligation while in the United States and Canada, it is not. In Malta it is a public holiday and in Maltese known as *L-Imnarja*.

This is the day of the liturgical year on which those newly created metropolitan archbishops receive the primary symbol of their office, the pallium, from the pope.



In Orthodox and Eastern Catholic Churches

For Eastern Orthodox and some Eastern Catholic Christians this feast also marks the end of the Apostles' Fast (which began on the Monday following All Saints' Sunday, i.e., the second Monday after Pentecost). It is considered a day of recommended attendance, whereon one should attend the All-Night Vigil (or at least Vespers) on the eve, and the Divine Liturgy on the morning of the feast (there are, however, no "Days of Obligation" in the Eastern Church). For those who follow the traditional Julian Calendar, 29 June falls on the Gregorian Calendar date of 12 July.

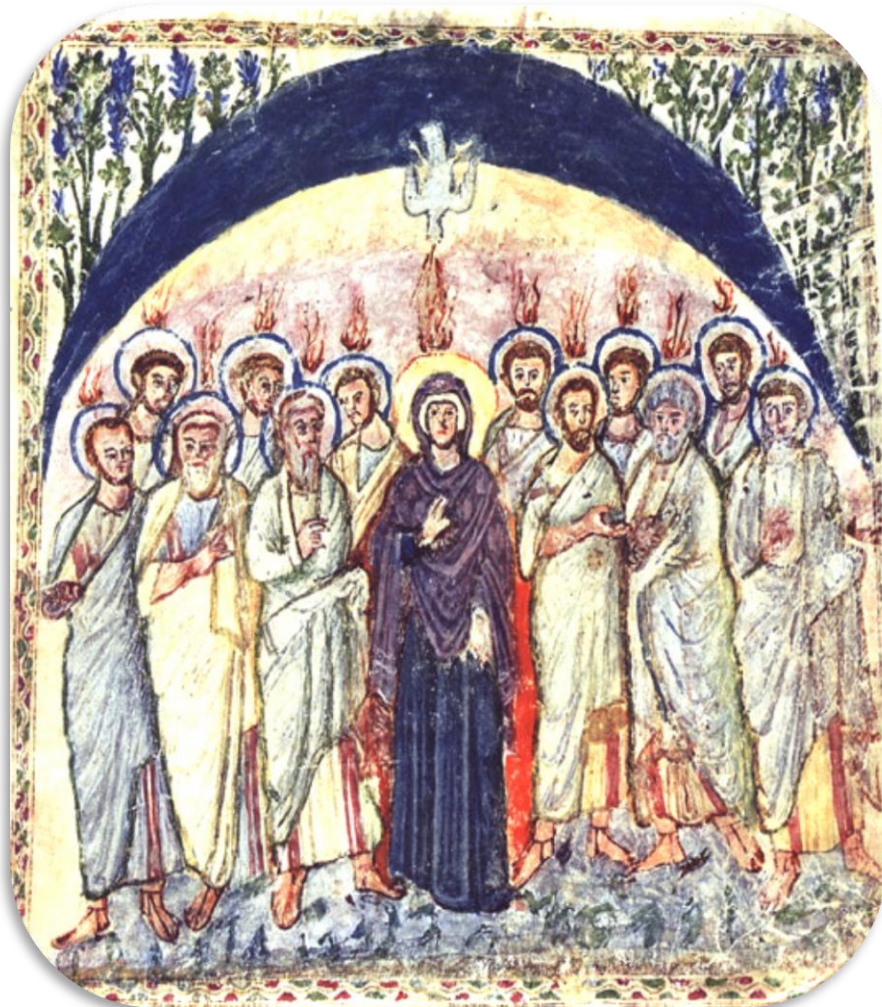
In the Russian Orthodox tradition, Macarius of Unzha's Miracle of the Moose is said to have occurred during the Apostles' Fast and the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul that followed it.

Ecumenical importance

In recent decades, this feast, along with that of Saint Andrew, has been of importance to the modern ecumenical movement as an occasion on which the pope and the Patriarch of Constantinople have officiated at services designed to bring their two churches closer to intercommunion. This was especially the case during the pontificate of Pope John Paul II, as reflected in his encyclical *Ut Unum Sint*.

Among Doukhobors

Although the Doukhobors do not venerate saints *per se*, the Feast of St. Peter and St. Paul has traditionally been a day of celebration for them. Since 1895, it has acquired a new significance as a commemoration of the *Burning of the Arms*, the Doukhobors' destruction of their weapons, as a symbol of their refusal to participate in government-sponsored killing. It is celebrated now by their descendants as simply "Peters Day", sometimes referred to as the *Doukhobor Peace Day*.

Maronite Miniature

In the Syriac-Maronite Church a magnificent legacy of icons is found in the Rabbula Gospel Book, written and illustrated in 586 A.D.

at the monastery of Saint John,
in northern Syria.

By 1361 this ancient manuscript passed to Kanubin, Lebanon, and in early 1500 the manuscript was gifted by the Maronite Patriarch to the Pope, and was placed in the Medici Library in Florence, Italy.

Rabbula is the scribe of the text; the icons were painted by different monks.

The Gospel Book consists of 14 pages (13.5" x 10.5") and 28 icons, most of which are miniatures of the scripture references.

Christian and Elie el-Chartouny**ST. SHARBEL MIRACLES**

After buying them a new car, their mother took them to participate in the holy mass in Abidjan for it was Saint Charbel's Day, on May 8. However, Christian and Elie refused to go into church and decided to go for a round. Their mother knelt in front of the Saint's photo asking him to protect them so that they come back safe. At about 11:30 p.m., she heard them when they came back home so she could sleep. When she woke up in the morning, she found them on the balcony, still awake, then they called her. When she got out, she saw the new car damaged. They told her that they were driving too fast and their car deviated and hit an electrical post, 10 km away from home.



At that moment, an old monk showed up, but they didn't see his face, he got close to the car and pulled it away from the post. He tied it to a cord and pulled it extremely fast, crossing these 10 km in two minutes. He stopped the car in front of their house, he removed the cord and disappeared.

The mother thanked Saint Charbel for saving her sons. She came on May 8, 2011 to the convent and got this miracle registered.

Archbishop Camomot declared 'venerable' by Pope Francis

Pope Francis on Saturday advanced the sainthood cause of Archbishop Teofilo Camomot declaring him "venerable".

After a meeting with Cardinal Marcello Semeraro, prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, the pope approved the heroic virtues of the Cebuano prelate.

Born in the city of Carcar, Archbishop Camomot was ordained as a priest for the Archdiocese of Cebu in 1941.

In 1955, he was appointed auxiliary bishop of Jaro in Iloilo province. Three years later, in 1958, he was named coadjutor archbishop of Cagayan de Oro.

The archbishop founded the Carmelite Tertiaries of the Blessed Eucharist in Misamis Occidental in November 1959. This would later become the Congregation of Santa Teresa.

After staying for 12 years in Cagayan de Oro, he resigned as coadjutor archbishop and returned to Cebu in 1970.

He died in a vehicular accident on September 27, 1988 at the age of 74.

"His dedication to the poor and detachment from material possessions were the trademarks of his ministry," the Cebu archdiocese said in a statement.

Archbishop Camomot, it added, was also "known for his fame of sanctity during his life, his death and after his death".

In December 2010, the archdiocese, during the incumbency of Cardinal Ricardo Vidal, opened the diocesan phase of the cause of the archbishop's beatification and canonization.

Upon the advise of the Vatican, Archbishop Jose Palma authorized the reopening of the diocesan process on the life, virtues and fame of sanctity of Archbishop Camomot.

The process started on January 5, 2016 until March 2, 2017. The Congregation of the Causes of Saints granted the decree of validity of the diocesan process on November 19, 2015.

The "Positio" on the life, virtues and fame of sanctity of Archbishop Camomot was submitted to the Vatican in 2020.

On October 21, 2021, the special congress composed of nine Theological Consultants gave their unanimous approval on the heroic virtues of the prelate.

The cardinals and bishops in the ordinary session of May 3, 2022, chaired by Cardinal Semeraro, affirmed that the Filipino prelate exercised the theological, cardinal and concomitant virtues to a heroic degree.

The pope would have to recognize a miracle attributed to the archbishop's intercession in order for him to be beatified, the next step toward sainthood. A second miracle would be needed for canonization.

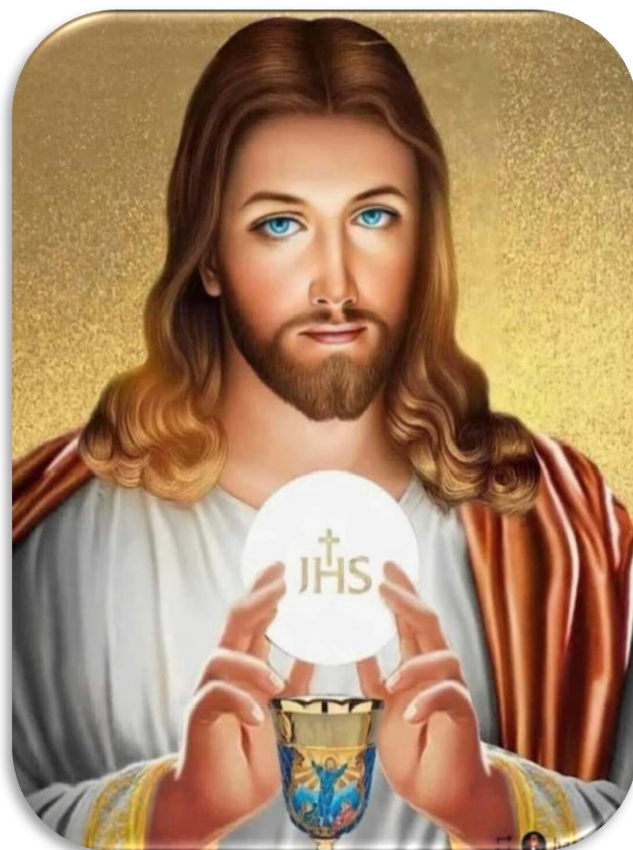
