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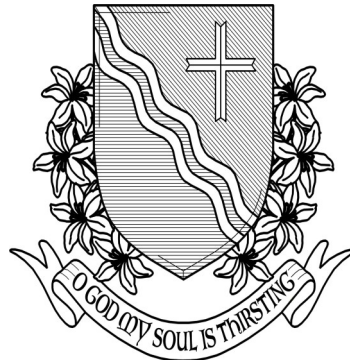
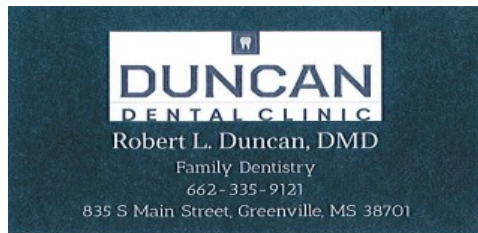

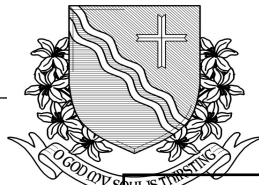

October 1—Divine Providence

Mass at 7:30 am

On the first of each month, the Catholic practice of praying to Divine Providence is a spiritual tradition to thank God for past blessings and ask for His continued guidance and provision for the upcoming month, specifically for necessities like food, shelter, clothing, health, and spiritual well-being. This devotion involves personal prayer, often in the form of an "Act of Abandonment" or a specific prayer for the month, and sometimes involves bringing offerings to church to symbolize entrusting one's needs to God's care. Bring a glass candle to the Mass to be blessed and used in your home during the month as a symbol of their prayer and dedication to Divine Providence.

Did you know that we might lose a couple of priests in 2026? If the law doesn’t change, priests who are here on a religious worker visa, such as some of our priests from Mexico, now have to go home for one year before reentering the U.S. on a green card. You can make a difference by encouraging your members of Congress to pass the bipartisan Religious Workforce Protection Act. 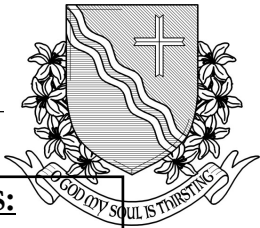
