SCRIPTURE READING Luke 15: 11—32

Jesus continued: "There was a man who had two sons. The younger one said to his father, 'Father, give me my share of the estate.' So he divided his property between them. After he had spent everything, there was a severe famine in that whole country, and he began to be in need.
