

Resilient Native Landscaping as a Living Educational Tool

The grounds of the Welcome and Discovery Center were originally landscaped not only to enhance the beauty and functionality of the building but also to serve as an educational resource for visitors. With funds raised through community support, selections from species found within the park were required. The resulting design featured butterfly gardens, shaded areas planted with native trees, and a water garden engineered to manage excess runoff. Meandering paths guided visitors through these natural learning spaces, creating an immersive experience in native ecology.

However, following a series of devastating hurricanes, the island —and the landscape—were severely impacted. Almost all of the original plantings were lost to wind and saltwater exposure.

Rather than view this as a loss, we responded with resilience and innovation. We documented the species that survived and used this data to form a second wave of planting—this time using only those native plants that had demonstrated high salt and storm tolerance. The redesigned landscape now serves as a model of ecological sustainability specific to barrier island environments.

Today, the grounds are not only visually and environmentally restorative, but they also function as a living laboratory for students, educators, visitors, and environmental professionals.

(Friends of Lovers Key).





How to Control Our Webcam

Embark on your virtual tour with some helpful tips below.

Instructions:

Click the icon with four arrows whenever you're watching the webcam livestream. This

will put you in a queue



for taking control of the webcam for a preset period of time. Only one viewer can control the camera at a time. The icon will turn yellow while you're waiting and turn green when you're

in control. Once you have control, click the eye icon in the top right corner of the video player to change the camera position.
