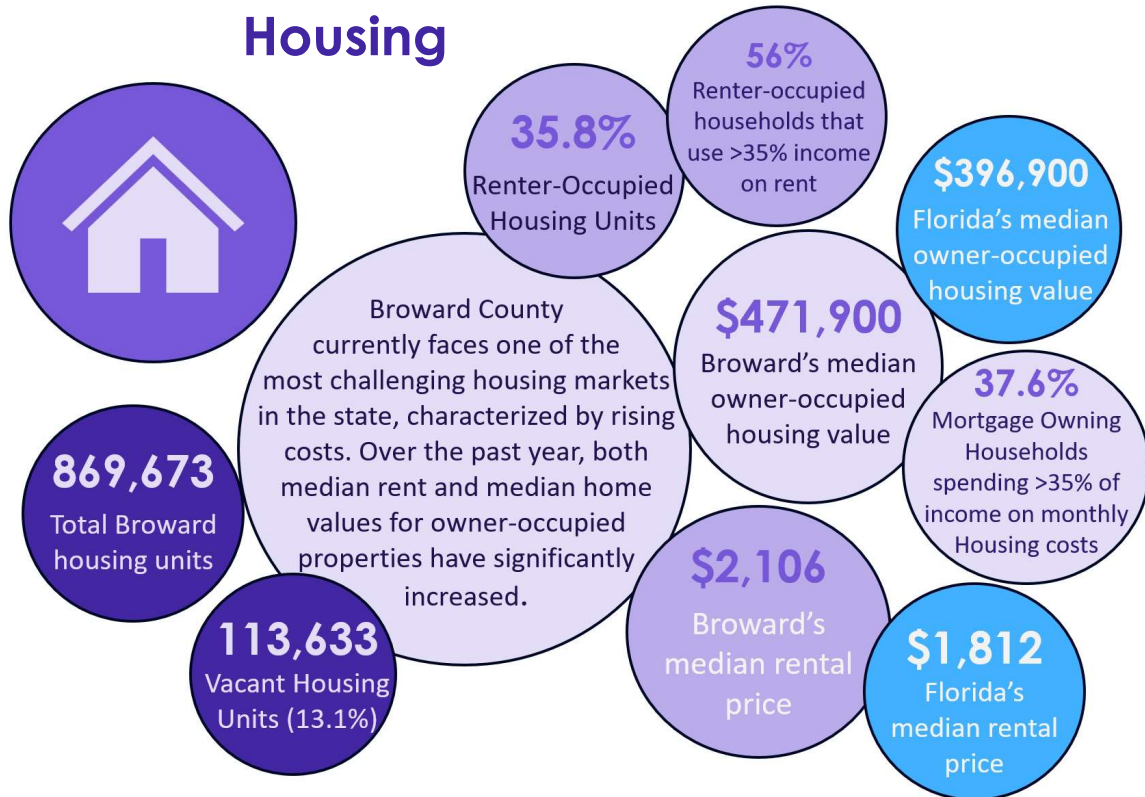

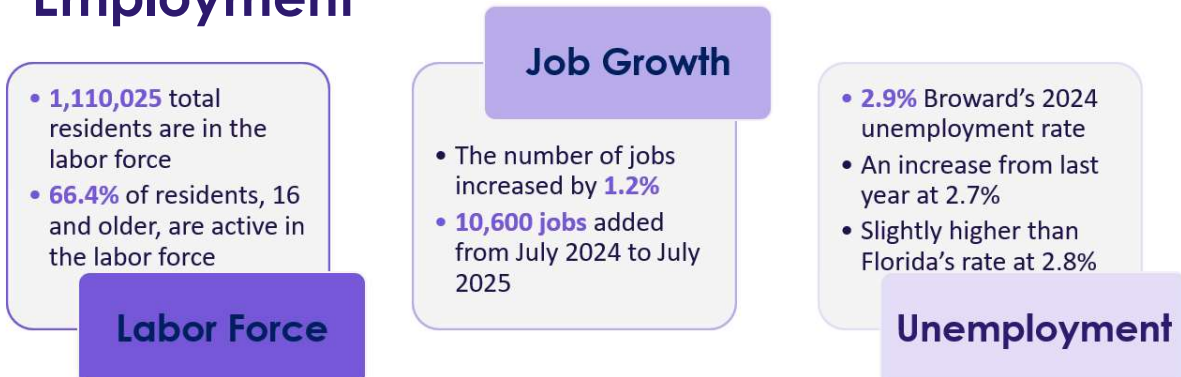

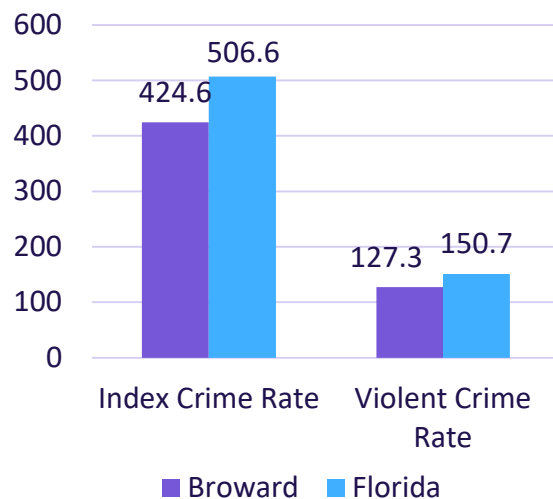

Crime (2023)



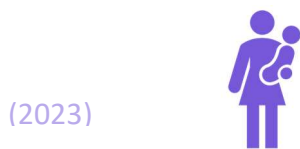

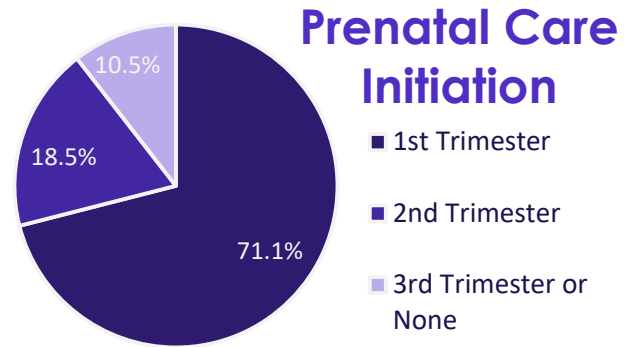

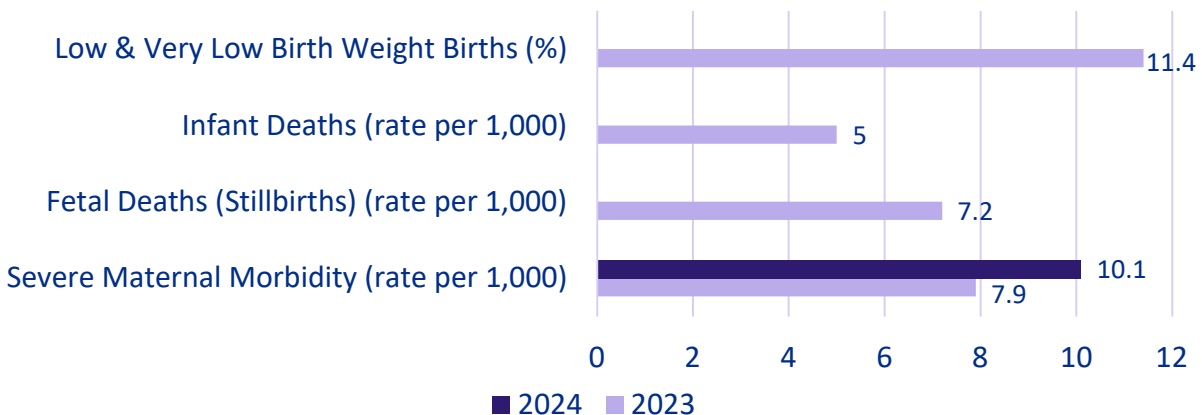
