



## Children's Ministry Intern – Summer 2026

### Position Overview

This internship offers the opportunity to develop skills in collaboration, adaptability, communication, creativity, innovation, digital tools, and problem-solving while working closely with staff, volunteers, and families. Interns will gain hands-on experience in designing engaging programs, leveraging digital platforms, and addressing challenges in a dynamic ministry environment.

### Responsibilities

- Assisting in weekend programming, scheduling, and managing volunteer rosters.
- Using Planning Center Check-Ins, People, and Services for attendance tracking, database management, and service scheduling.
- Managing social media campaigns to promote and support the ministry.
- Assisting the Director of Children's Ministry in sharing teaching content, hallway presence, and a welcoming demeanour on Sundays.
- Providing leadership for Sunday morning programming set-up and tear-down, connecting with classroom leaders, children, and families.
- Planning, developing, and implementing mid-week summer programming activities for the church and local community.

### Hours & Compensation

- 30 hours/week — not to exceed 270 hours total.
- Flexible scheduling available in consultation with the Director of Children's Ministry.
- Compensation: \$17.60/hour | Start: June 29, 2026 | End: August 28, 2026.
